# H. R. 3691

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## AN ACT

To require the TSA to develop a plan to ensure that TSA material disseminated in major airports can be better understood by more people accessing such airports, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “TSA Reaching Across  
3 Nationalities, Societies, and Languages to Advance Trav-  
4 eler Education Act” or the “TRANSLATE Act”.

5 **SEC. 2. PLAN.**

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days after the  
7 date of the enactment of this Act, the Administrator of  
8 the Transportation Security Administration (TSA) shall  
9 submit to the Committee on Homeland Security of the  
10 House of Representatives and the Committee on Com-  
11 merce, Science, and Transportation of the Senate a plan  
12 to ensure that TSA material disseminated in major air-  
13 ports can be better understood by more people accessing  
14 such airports.

15 (b) CONTENTS.—The plan required under subsection  
16 (a) shall include the following:

17 (1) An identification of the most common lan-  
18 guages other than English that are the primary lan-  
19 guages of individuals that travel through or work in  
20 each major airport.

21 (2) A plan to improve—

22 (A) TSA materials to communicate infor-  
23 mation in languages identified pursuant to  
24 paragraph (1); and

25 (B) the communication of TSA material to  
26 individuals with vision or hearing impairments

1           or other possible barriers to understanding such  
2           material.

3       (c) CONSIDERATIONS.—In developing the plan re-  
4       quired under subsection (a), the Administrator of the  
5       TSA, acting through the Office of Civil Rights and Lib-  
6       erties, Ombudsman and Traveler Engagement of the TSA,  
7       shall take into consideration data regarding the following:

8           (1) International enplanement.

9           (2) Local populations surrounding major air-  
10       ports.

11       (d) IMPLEMENTATION.—Not later than 180 days  
12       after the submission of the plan required under subsection  
13       (a), the Administrator of the TSA shall implement such  
14       plan.

15       (e) GAO REVIEW.—Not later than 1 year after the  
16       implementation pursuant to subsection (d) of the plan re-  
17       quired under subsection (a), the Comptroller General of  
18       the United States shall submit to the Committee on  
19       Homeland Security of the House of Representatives and  
20       the Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation  
21       of the Senate a review of such implementation.

22       (f) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

23           (1) AIRPORT.—The term “airport” has the  
24       meaning given such term in section 40102 of title  
25       49, United States Code.

1           (2) MAJOR AIRPORTS.—The term “major air-  
2       ports” means Category X and Category I airports.

3           (3) TSA MATERIAL.—The term “TSA mate-  
4       rial” means signs, videos, audio messages, websites,  
5       press releases, social media postings, and other com-  
6       munications published and disseminated by the Ad-  
7       ministrator of the TSA in Category X and Category  
8       I airports.
