## Public Health – Expedited Partner Therapy – <u>Trichomoniasis and</u> Pharmacist Dispensing

FOR the purpose of *authorizing*, *notwithstanding any other provision of law*, *certain health* 4 care providers to prescribe, dispense, or otherwise provide antibiotic therapy to a  $\mathbf{5}$ certain partner of a patient diagnosed with trichomoniasis without making a certain 6 7 physical assessment; authorizing, notwithstanding any other provision of law, a 8 licensed pharmacist to dispense antibiotic therapy prescribed to certain partners of 9 patients diagnosed with certain sexually transmitted infections without making a certain physical assessment; and generally relating to expedited partner therapy and 10 11 dispensing of antibiotic therapy by a licensed pharmacist.
