8 9 10 11 12	(2) The first $\$100$ $\$50$ $\$100$ of child support collected in a month for one child and the first $\$200$ $\$100$ $\$200$ of child support collected in a month for two or more children shall pass through to the family and shall be disregarded in computing the amount of assistance.
13 14 15	(3) For eligible recipients who obtain unsubsidized employment, the amount of assistance shall be computed by counting no more than 4 weeks of earned income in any month and disregarding 40% of that earned income.
