A BILL

- To authorize the Secretary of Transportation to designate certain entities as centers of excellence for domestic maritime workforce training and education, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Domestic Maritime
 - 5 Centers of Excellence Act of 2017".
 - 6 SEC. 2. DOMESTIC MARITIME CENTERS OF EXCELLENCE.
 - 7 (a) Designation Authority.—The Secretary of
 - 8 Transportation is authorized to designate community and

1	technical colleges with a maritime training program and
2	maritime training centers operated by or under the super-
3	vision of a State, if located in the United States along
4	the Gulf of Mexico, Atlantic Ocean, Pacific Ocean, Arctic
5	Ocean, Bering Sea, Gulf of Alaska, or Great Lakes, as
6	centers of excellence for domestic maritime workforce
7	training and education.
8	(b) Assistance.—
9	(1) Types.—The Secretary may provide to an
10	entity designated as a center of excellence under
11	subsection (a)—
12	(A) technical assistance;
13	(B) surplus Federal equipment and assets
14	and
15	(C) funding.
16	(2) Purposes.—The Secretary may provide as-
17	sistance under paragraph (1)—
18	(A) to support a maritime workforce pro-
19	gram; and
20	(B) to assist an entity designated as a cen-
21	ter of excellence under subsection (a) to expand
22	the capacity of the entity to train the domestic
23	maritime workforce of the United States, in-
24	cluding by—
25	(i) admitting additional students;

1	(ii) recruiting and training faculty;
2	(iii) expanding facilities;
3	(iv) creating new maritime career
4	pathways; and
5	(v) awarding students credit for prior
6	experience, including military service.
