A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Industrial Partnerships – Sustainable Materials Management Program – Established

- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Industrial Partnerships Program to enter into $\mathbf{5}$ a certain memorandum of understanding with certain agencies to establish a 6 Sustainable Materials Management Program; requiring the memorandum of understanding to include certain information; requiring the Governor to appropriate 7 8 a certain amount in certain fiscal years to the Maryland Technology Development 9 Corporation for a certain program; requiring the Maryland Technology Development Corporation to distribute certain funds to the Maryland Industrial Partnerships 10 11 Program for a certain purpose; providing that certain funding is to supplement, but 12not supplant, certain funds; requiring the Maryland Port Authority and the 13 Department of the Environment to allocate certain funds to the Maryland 14 Technology Development Corporation; requiring the Maryland Industrial 15Partnerships Program to submit certain reports to certain legislative committees on 16 or before certain dates; requiring the Sustainable Materials Management Program 17in the Maryland Industrial Partnerships Program to employ a full-time director to 18 take certain actions; defining certain terms; and generally relating to the Maryland 19 Industrial Partnerships Program.

2 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "PROGRAM" MEANS THE SUSTAINABLE MATERIALS 3 MANAGEMENT PROGRAM IN THE MARYLAND INDUSTRIAL PARTNERSHIPS 4 PROGRAM.

 $\mathbf{5}$ **(B)** (1) ON OR BEFORE JULY 1, 2021, THE MARYLAND INDUSTRIAL PARTNERSHIPS PROGRAM SHALL ENTER INTO A MEMORANDUM 6 OF UNDERSTANDING WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF THE ENVIRONMENT AND THE 7 MARYLAND PORT ADMINISTRATION TO ESTABLISH A SUSTAINABLE MATERIALS 8 MANAGEMENT PROGRAM IN THE MARYLAND INDUSTRIAL PARTNERSHIPS 9 PROGRAM TO ADMINISTER GRANTS FOR RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT OF 10 SUSTAINABLE MATERIALS MANAGEMENT PROJECTS. 11

5 (C) (1) IN FISCAL YEARS 2022 THROUGH 2029, AND EACH FISCAL YEAR 6 THEREAFTER, THE GOVERNOR SHALL APPROPRIATE AT LEAST \$200,000 TO THE 7 MARYLAND TECHNOLOGY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION FOR THE PROGRAM.

8 (2) THE MARYLAND TECHNOLOGY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION 9 SHALL DISTRIBUTE THE FUNDS UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION TO 10 THE MARYLAND INDUSTRIAL PARTNERSHIPS PROGRAM TO ADMINISTER THE 11 PROGRAM.
