A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 3 of Title 35 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the
- 2 Georgia Bureau of Investigation, so as to provide for a green alert program to notify the
- 3 public when a veteran or military service member known to have a physical or mental health
- 4 condition related to his or her service, or who is at imminent risk of self-harm, is missing;
- 5 to provide for definitions; to provide for procedures and cooperation of state agencies; to
- 6 provide for certain immunities; to provide for a short title; to provide for related matters; to
- 7 repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

- 9 SECTION 1.
- 10 Chapter 3 of Title 35 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the Georgia
- Bureau of Investigation, is amended by adding a new article to read as follows:
- 12 "<u>ARTICLE 10</u>
- 13 <u>35-3-220.</u>
- 14 This article shall be known and may be cited as the 'Green Call Act.'
- 15 <u>35-3-221.</u>
- 16 As used in this article, the term:
- 17 (1) 'Alert system' means the state-wide 'Green Call' alert system for missing veterans and
- military service members established under this article.
- 19 (2) 'At-risk veteran or military service member' means a veteran or military service
- 20 <u>member:</u>
- 21 (A) Who has a physical or mental condition related to such person's service in the
- 22 <u>military; or</u>

23 (B) Whose disappearance poses a credible threat to his or her safety or health, as

- 24 <u>determined by a local law enforcement agency.</u>
- 25 (3) 'Local law enforcement agency' means a law enforcement agency with jurisdiction
- 26 <u>over the investigation of a missing veteran or military service member.</u>
- 27 (4) 'Veteran or military service member' means a person who has served or is serving as
- 28 <u>a member of the regular, reserve, or National Guard component of the United States</u>
- 29 <u>armed forces or the United States Coast Guard.</u>
- 30 <u>35-3-222.</u>
- 31 (a) With the cooperation of the office of the Governor, the Georgia Lottery Corporation,
- 32 <u>and other appropriate law enforcement agencies in this state, the bureau shall develop and</u>
- 33 <u>implement a state-wide alert system to be activated on behalf of missing at-risk veterans</u>
- 34 <u>or military service members.</u>
- 35 (b) Activation of a state-wide missing person alert system shall not prevent or prohibit any
- 36 <u>other state or local law enforcement agency from taking additional measures in response</u>
- 37 <u>to the receipt of a missing person report.</u>
- 38 <u>35-3-223.</u>
- 39 (a) The director shall be the state-wide coordinator of the alert system.
- 40 (b) The director shall adopt rules and issue directives as necessary to ensure proper
- 41 <u>implementation of the alert system. The rules and directives shall include instructions on</u>
- 42 <u>the procedures for activating and deactivating the alert system.</u>
- 43 (c) The director shall prescribe forms for use by local law enforcement agencies in
- 44 <u>requesting activation of the alert system.</u>
- 45 (d) No rule or directive adopted by the director shall mandate a minimum waiting period
- 46 <u>before the alert system may be activated or a request by local law enforcement agencies</u>
- 47 <u>may be submitted to the bureau; provided, however, that it shall remain within the</u>
- 48 <u>discretion of the director, as provided in this article, whether the alert system shall be</u>
- 49 <u>activated at the request of a local law enforcement agency.</u>
- 50 (e) When making a determination whether to activate or whether to request the activation
- of the state-wide missing person alert system, both the director and the requesting local law
- 52 <u>enforcement agency shall take into consideration the known medical condition of the</u>
- 53 missing person if the medical condition may reasonably be considered a cause for the
- 54 <u>inability to locate such missing person</u>. In so considering the medical condition of a
- 55 missing person, particularly if such condition may be immediately life-threatening or
- 56 <u>incapacitating</u>, the director or other authorized person and the requesting law enforcement

57 <u>official shall be authorized, within his or her discretion, to initiate and request, respectively,</u>

- 58 <u>a state-wide endangered person advisory.</u>
- 59 <u>35-3-224.</u>
- 60 (a) The bureau shall recruit public and commercial television, radio, cable, print, and other
- 61 media, private commercial entities, state or local governmental entities, the public, and
- other appropriate persons to assist in developing and implementing the alert system.
- 63 (b) The bureau may enter into agreements with participants in the alert system to provide
- 64 <u>necessary support for the alert system.</u>
- 65 35-3-225.
- 66 (a) When a local law enforcement agency receives notice of a missing at-risk veteran or
- 67 <u>military service member, such agency shall require the reporting person to provide</u>
- documentation of the missing at-risk veteran or military service member's physical or
- 69 mental condition or provide clear, identifiable proof that the missing at-risk veteran or
- 70 <u>military service member is at imminent risk of self-harm. The director shall promulgate</u>
- 71 <u>by rule and regulation procedures which the local law enforcement agency shall follow to</u>
- 72 <u>verify that the at-risk veteran or military service member is missing and has a physical or</u>
- 73 mental condition related to such person's military service or that identifiable proof exists
- 74 that the at-risk veteran or military service member is at imminent risk of self-harm. Once
- 75 <u>the local law enforcement agency verifies that the at-risk veteran or military service</u>
- member is missing and has a physical or mental condition related to such person's military
- 37 service or that identifiable proof exists that the at-risk veteran or military service member
- is at imminent risk of self-harm, the local law enforcement agency shall be authorized to
- 79 <u>notify the bureau and request the alert system be activated.</u>
- 80 (b) On notification by a local law enforcement agency that an at-risk veteran or military
- 81 <u>service member is missing, the director shall activate the alert system and notify</u>
- appropriate participants in the alert system, as established by rule, if:
- 83 (1) A local law enforcement agency believes that such at-risk veteran or military service
- 84 <u>member is missing;</u>
- 85 (2) A local law enforcement agency believes that such at-risk veteran or military service
- 86 <u>member is in immediate danger of serious bodily injury or death;</u>
- 87 (3) A local law enforcement agency confirms that an investigation has taken place that
- 88 <u>verifies the disappearance and eliminates alternative explanations for the at-risk veteran</u>
- 89 <u>or military service member's disappearance; and</u>
- 90 (4) Sufficient information is available to disseminate to the public that could assist in
- 91 <u>locating such at-risk veteran or military service member.</u>

92 (c) The area of the alert may be less than state wide if the director determines that the

- 93 <u>nature of the event makes it probable that the at-risk veteran or military service member</u>
- 94 <u>did not leave a certain geographic location.</u>
- 95 (d) The bureau may modify the criteria described by subsection (b) of this Code section
- as necessary for the proper implementation of the alert system.
- 97 <u>35-3-226.</u>
- 98 (a) A state agency participating in the alert system shall:
- 99 (1) Cooperate with the bureau and assist in developing and implementing the alert
- 100 <u>system;</u>
- 101 (2) Establish a plan for providing relevant information to its officers, investigators, or
- employees, as appropriate, once the alert system has been activated; and
- 103 (3) Utilize a rapid response telephone system that alerts residents in a targeted area.
- 104 (b) The Georgia Lottery Corporation is directed to develop a method of notifying its
- vendors within an alert area of an alert in a manner designed to disseminate alert
- information to customers at its retail locations.

- The director shall terminate any activation of the alert system with respect to a particular
- at-risk veteran or military service member if:
- 110 (1) The person is located or the disappearance is otherwise resolved; or
- 111 (2) The director determines that the alert system is no longer an effective tool for
- locating and recovering the at-risk veteran or military service member.
- 113 <u>35-3-228.</u>
- 114 (a) Any entity or individual participating in the alert system pursuant to this article shall
- not be liable for any civil damages arising from the dissemination of any alert generated
- pursuant to the alert system.
- 117 (b) Nothing in this article shall be construed to limit or restrict in any way any legal
- protection an individual or entity may have under any other law for disseminating any
- 119 <u>information.</u>"

121 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
