15	(a) In this section, "sexual abuse" means any act that involves:

- 4 (b) Except as provided under subsection (d) of this section and notwithstanding any time limitation under a statute of limitations, a statute of repose, the Maryland Tort Claims Act, the Local Government Tort Claims Act, or any other law, an action for damages arising out of an alleged incident or incidents of sexual abuse that occurred while the victim was a minor may be filed at any time.
- 9 (c) Except as provided in §§ 5–303 and 5–518 of this title and § 12–104 of the State Government Article, the total amount of noneconomic damages that may be awarded under this section to a single claimant in an action against a single defendant for injuries arising from an incident or occurrence that would have been barred by a time limitation before October 1, 2023, may not exceed \$1,500,000.
- 14 (d) (1) [No action] THIS SUBSECTION APPLIES ONLY TO ACTIONS for damages UNDER THIS SECTION that would have been barred by a time limitation before 16 October 1, 2023[,].
- 17 **(2) AN ACTION** may **NOT** be brought [under this section] if the alleged victim of abuse is deceased at the commencement of the action.
- 19 (3) AN ACTION AGAINST THE STATE OR A UNIT OF STATE 20 GOVERNMENT MAY NOT BE FILED ON OR AFTER JANUARY 1, 2026.
- 21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 22 October 1, 2025.
