A BILL

To amend title 31, United States Code, to limit the use of Federal funds for travel by the President if the President's annual budget submission to Congress is late, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Presidential Budget
- 5 Accountability Act".

1	SEC. 2. LIMITATION ON USE OF FEDERAL FUNDS FOR
2	PRESIDENTIAL TRAVEL EXPENSES IF PRESI-
3	DENT'S BUDGET IS LATE.
4	Section 1105 of title 31, United States Code, is
5	amended by adding at the end the following:
6	"(j) If the budget under subsection (a) is not sub-
7	mitted to Congress on or before the first Monday in Feb-
8	ruary of a year, no Federal funds may be obligated or
9	expended for the cost of travel by the President during
10	the period beginning on the first Tuesday of February of
11	such year and ending on the date the budget is submitted.
12	For purposes of this subsection, the term 'Federal funds'
13	includes amounts made available for—
14	"(1) the expense allowance of the President
15	under section 102 of title 3;
16	"(2) travel expenses of the President under sec-
17	tion 103 of title 3;
18	"(3) entertainment expenses of the President
19	under section 105(d)(3) of title 3; and
20	"(4) subsistence expenses in connection with
21	the travel of the President in section 105(d)(4) of
22	title 3.".
