A BILL

To require the Corps of Engineers to carry out an assessment of the resiliency of the Great Lakes coastline, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Great Lakes Coastal
- 5 Resiliency Act of 2019".

1 SEC. 2. GREAT LAKES COASTAL RESILIENCY STUDY.

2	(a) Study.—The Secretary shall carry out an assess-
3	ment, under section 729 of the Water Resources Develop-
4	ment Act of 1986 (33 U.S.C. 2267a), of the resiliency of
5	the Great Lakes coastline, with a focus on—
6	(1) areas specifically vulnerable to rising water
7	levels and severe weather; and
8	(2) lake conditions that contribute to coastal
9	erosion, sustained flooding, and damage to critical
10	infrastructure and residential and commercial prop-
11	erties.
12	(b) Consultation.—The Secretary shall consult
13	with the Director of the Office of Management and Budget
14	in determining the scope of the assessment under sub-
15	section (a).
16	(c) Report.—Not later than 3 years after the date
17	of enactment of this section, the Secretary shall submit
18	to Congress a report containing—
19	(1) the results of the assessment carried out
20	under subsection (a); and
21	(2) any recommendations resulting from such
22	assessment, which shall—
23	(A) take into account watershed sediment
24	loading; and

1	(B) include recommendations to improve
2	the resiliency of the Great Lakes coastline to
3	rising water levels and severe weather.

(d) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

- (1) Great Lakes coastline" means the shoreline along the five Great Lakes and their connecting channels in the states of Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Minnesota, New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania, and Wisconsin.
- (2) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means the Secretary of the Army, acting through the Chief of Engineers.

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
