### A BILL

To authorize the Women Who Worked on the Home Front Foundation to establish a commemorative work in the District of Columbia and its environs, and for other purposes. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Women Who Worked
5 on the Home Front World War II Memorial Act".

## 6 SEC. 2. AUTHORIZATION TO ESTABLISH COMMEMORATIVE 7 WORK.

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Women Who Worked on the 9 Home Front Foundation may establish a commemorative 10 work on Federal land in the District of Columbia and its 11 environs to commemorate the commitment and service rep-12 resented by women who worked on the home front during 13 World War II.

(b) COMPLIANCE WITH STANDARDS FOR COMMEMORATIVE WORKS.—The establishment of the commemorative
work under this section shall be in accordance with chapter
89 of title 40, United States Code (commonly known as the
"Commemorative Works Act").

(c) PROHIBITION ON THE USE OF FEDERAL FUNDS.—
(1) IN GENERAL.—Federal funds may not be
used to pay any expense of the establishment of the
commemorative work under this section.

23 (2) RESPONSIBILITY OF WOMEN WHO WORKED
24 ON THE HOME FRONT FOUNDATION.—The Women
25 Who Worked on the Home Front Foundation shall be

1 solely responsible for acceptance of contributions for, 2 and payment of the expenses of, the establishment of the commemorative work under this section. 3 4 (d) Deposit of Excess Funds.— (1) IN GENERAL.—If upon payment of all ex-5 6 penses for the establishment of the memorial (includ-7 ing the maintenance and preservation amount re-8 quired by section 8906(b)(1) of title 40, United States 9 Code), there remains a balance of funds received for the establishment of the commemorative work, the 10 11 Women Who Worked on the Home Front Foundation 12 shall transmit the amount of the balance to the Sec-13 retary of the Interior for deposit in the account provided for in section 8906(b)(3) of title 40. United 14 15 States Code. (2) ON EXPIRATION OF AUTHORITY.—If upon ex-16

17 piration of the authority for the commemorative work 18 under section 8903(e) of title 40, United States Code, 19 there remains a balance of funds received for the es-20 tablishment of the commemorative work, the Women 21 Who Worked on the Home Front Foundation shall 22 transmit the amount of the balance to a separate ac-23 count with the National Park Foundation for memo-24 rials, to be available to the Secretary of the Interior 25 or Administrator (as appropriate) following the proc-

3	8906(b)(2) or (3) of title 40, United States Code.
