A BILL

To authorize the Women Who Worked on the Home Front Foundation to establish a commemorative work in the District of Columbia and its environs, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 *This Act may be cited as the “Women Who Worked*
5 *on the Home Front World War II Memorial Act”.*

6 **SEC. 2. AUTHORIZATION TO ESTABLISH COMMEMORATIVE**
7 **WORK.**

8 *(a) IN GENERAL.—The Women Who Worked on the*
9 *Home Front Foundation may establish a commemorative*
10 *work on Federal land in the District of Columbia and its*
11 *environs to commemorate the commitment and service rep-*
12 *resented by women who worked on the home front during*
13 *World War II.*

14 *(b) COMPLIANCE WITH STANDARDS FOR COMMEMORA-*
15 *TIVE WORKS.—The establishment of the commemorative*
16 *work under this section shall be in accordance with chapter*
17 *89 of title 40, United States Code (commonly known as the*
18 *“Commemorative Works Act”).*

19 *(c) PROHIBITION ON THE USE OF FEDERAL FUNDS.—*

20 *(1) IN GENERAL.—Federal funds may not be*
21 *used to pay any expense of the establishment of the*
22 *commemorative work under this section.*

23 *(2) RESPONSIBILITY OF WOMEN WHO WORKED*
24 *ON THE HOME FRONT FOUNDATION.—The Women*
25 *Who Worked on the Home Front Foundation shall be*

1 *solely responsible for acceptance of contributions for,*
2 *and payment of the expenses of, the establishment of*
3 *the commemorative work under this section.*

4 *(d) DEPOSIT OF EXCESS FUNDS.—*

5 *(1) IN GENERAL.—If upon payment of all ex-*
6 *penses for the establishment of the memorial (includ-*
7 *ing the maintenance and preservation amount re-*
8 *quired by section 8906(b)(1) of title 40, United States*
9 *Code), there remains a balance of funds received for*
10 *the establishment of the commemorative work, the*
11 *Women Who Worked on the Home Front Foundation*
12 *shall transmit the amount of the balance to the Sec-*
13 *retary of the Interior for deposit in the account pro-*
14 *vided for in section 8906(b)(3) of title 40, United*
15 *States Code.*

16 *(2) ON EXPIRATION OF AUTHORITY.—If upon ex-*
17 *piration of the authority for the commemorative work*
18 *under section 8903(e) of title 40, United States Code,*
19 *there remains a balance of funds received for the es-*
20 *tablishment of the commemorative work, the Women*
21 *Who Worked on the Home Front Foundation shall*
22 *transmit the amount of the balance to a separate ac-*
23 *count with the National Park Foundation for memo-*
24 *rials, to be available to the Secretary of the Interior*
25 *or Administrator (as appropriate) following the proc-*

1 *ess provided in section 8906(b)(4) of title 40, United*
2 *States Code, for accounts established under section*
3 *8906(b)(2) or (3) of title 40, United States Code.*
