3 FOR the purpose of requiring that a certain statement included on the signature page of a 4 petition seeking to place a question on the ballot be written in plain language reasonably calculated to be understood by an individual who has attained no higher $\mathbf{5}$ 6 than a certain level of reading comprehension; requiring that a certain statement 7 about the purpose of a question on the ballot be written in plain language reasonably 8 calculated to be understood by an individual who has attained no higher than a 9 certain level of reading comprehension; providing for a delayed effective date; and 10generally relating to petitions and ballot questions.
