# A BILL

- To amend the national service laws to prioritize national service programs and projects that are directly related to the response to and recovery from the COVID-19 public health emergency, and for other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

## **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Pandemic Response
- 5 and Opportunity Through National Service Act".

## 1 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

2 Congress finds the following:

3 (1) The United States has a strong history of
4 citizen response to national calls to service in order
5 to help the Nation recover in times of crisis.

6 (2) More than 80 years ago, the Nation rose to 7 the challenge of the Great Depression with the cre-8 ation of citizen service programs like the Civilian 9 Conservation Corps (referred to in this section as 10 the "CCC") and the Works Progress Administration 11 (referred to in this section as the "WPA").

(3) Millions of participants benefitted from paid
employment and opportunities to develop their skills
while constructing national parks and public lands
infrastructure and producing cultural works still enjoyed today.

17 (4) Following decades of evolution, incor18 porating policies of both political parties, today's na19 tional service programs carry on the legacy of the
20 CCC and WPA.

(5) Founded in 1990, the Corporation for National and Community Service today coordinates national service by individuals in the United States
across every State and territory, partnering with
State-level commissions and supporting locally driv-

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1	en services in partnership with nongovernmental or-
2	ganizations and State governments.
3	(6) National service programs provide public
4	health, education, employment training, and nutri-
5	tion services for which the Nation has a critical need
6	in the current crisis.
7	(7) The signature programs of the Corporation
8	for National and Community Service, which are the
9	AmeriCorps State and National, AmeriCorps Na-
10	tional Civilian Community Corps, AmeriCorps
11	VISTA, and National Senior Service Corps pro-
12	grams, can and should be expanded to meet current
13	needs.
14	(8) The novel coronavirus pandemic has in-
15	fected and killed individuals in every State and terri-
16	tory, causing more than 1,000,000 cases and 65,000
17	deaths so far.
18	(9) In response, States, tribal governments, and
19	cities across the country have closed down busi-
20	nesses, schools, and public events, leading to a dra-
21	matic drop in economic activity and a sharp pro-
22	jected decline in the United States economy.
23	(10) More than 30,000,000 applications for un-
24	employment benefits have been filed in recent weeks,

with weekly filings repeatedly exceeding historic
 record levels.

3 (11) More than 1 in every 10 adults in the
4 United States has applied for unemployment insur5 ance since the crisis began.

6 (12) Public health leaders agree that to safely
7 reopen the Nation and revive its economy, a massive
8 effort to test millions of individuals in the United
9 States and to trace contacts of those who are or may
10 be infected is needed.

(13) To recover, the Nation also needs meaningful employment opportunities, as well as a significant expansion of the human capital working to address community needs around public health, behavioral health, hunger, education, and conservation.

(14) As the Nation works to respond to and recover from the current twin challenges of a public
health pandemic and an economic crisis, national
service presents a unique opportunity for flexible, locally driven responses to meet State and local public
health, employment, and recovery needs.

# 22 SEC. 3. PURPOSES.

23 The purposes of this Act are—

(1) to provide for 750,000 participants, over 3
years, in national service programs, such as the

1	Public Land Corps (also known as the 21st Century
2	Conservation Service Corps) programs and other
3	AmeriCorps programs, that will provide services in
4	response to the pandemic and economic crisis, in-
5	cluding to help satisfy the projected need for as
6	many as 300,000 additional public health workers;
7	(2) to ensure that participant allowances cover
8	the reasonable cost of participation and provide par-
9	ticipants with economic and educational opportunity;
10	(3) to stabilize such national service programs
11	during economic crisis; and
12	(4) to support opportunities for all individuals
13	in the United States to engage in service.

14 (C) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments

tional Service Trust established under section 145 of the
 National and Community Service Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C.
 12601), including the national service educational award
 described in subtitle D of title I of such Act (42 U.S.C.
 12601 et seq.).".

6 (B) EXCLUSION OF DISCHARGE OF STU7 DENT LOAN DEBT.—Subsection (f) of section
8 108 of such Code is amended by adding at the
9 end the following new paragraph:

10 "(6) PAYMENTS UNDER NATIONAL SERVICE 11 EDUCATIONAL AWARD PROGRAMS.—In the case of 12 an individual, gross income shall not include any 13 amount received as a national service educational 14 award under subtitle D of title I of the National and 15 Community Service Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. 12601 16 et seq.).".

(a) COORDINATION WITH OTHER YOUTH PROGRAMS.—Section 193A of the National and Community

adding at the end the following:

1	plan and make recommendations in the plan to im-
2	prove coordination between covered programs and
3	programs of the Corporation to meet the needs of
4	underserved youth, such as economically disadvan-
5	taged youth, minority youth, youth who left school
6	without a secondary school diploma, formerly incar-
7	cerated or court-involved youth, youth who are chil-
8	dren of an incarcerated parent, youth in foster care
9	(including youth aging out of foster care), migrant
10	youth, and other youth who are neither enrolled in
11	secondary or postsecondary school or participating in
12	the labor market.".
13	(b) Platform for National Senior Service
14	CORPS.—Title IV of the Domestic Volunteer Service Act
15	of 1973 is amended—
16	(1) by redesignating section $421$ (42 U.S.C.
17	5061), amended by section 4(b), as section 401;
18	(2) by moving that section 401 so as to follow
19	the title heading for title IV; and
20	(3) by inserting after section 420 (42 U.S.C.
21	5059) the following:
22	"SEC. 421. ONLINE SERVICE PLATFORM.
23	"(a) ESTABLISHMENT.—The Chief Executive Officer
24	of the Corporation shall establish an online service plat-
25	form with a gateway to connect volunteers in the National

Senior Service Corps with service projects and enable the
 volunteers to carry out distance volunteer services. The
 platform shall be linked to and placed prominently on the
 website of the Corporation. The Corporation may enter
 into a contract with a public entity to create the platform.

6 "(b) Training Resources and Information.—

7 "(1) IN GENERAL.—The Corporation shall pro8 vide training resources, information, and guidance
9 for the volunteers on the platform.

10 "(2) INFORMATION.—The Corporation shall
11 provide information to regional offices of the Cor12 poration about how to get volunteers in the National
13 Senior Service Corps connected to the platform
14 through the gateway.

15 "(3) GUIDANCE.—The Corporation shall issue
16 guidance for the regional offices about how to trans17 fer the programs of the National Senior Service
18 Corps to the platform.

"(4) OUTREACH.—The Corporation shall provide outreach services to promote the platform including outreach to institutions of higher education,
the Department of Veterans Affairs for mentorship
projects, and State and local governments for community engagement projects.".

(c) OUTREACH AND PROMOTION CAMPAIGN.—Sec tion 193A(g) of such Act is amended by adding at the
 end the following:
