8	SYNOPSIS:	Under current law, attempting to elude a law
9		enforcement officer is a Class A misdemeanor unless
10		the flight or attempt to elude causes the death or
11		physical injury to an innocent person, in which
12		case the violation is a Class C felony.
13		This bill would provide that a violation of
14		attempting to elude would constitute a Class C
15		felony and violation of attempting to elude that
16		causes death or physical injury would constitute a
17		Class B felony.
18		Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama
19		of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the
20		Official Recompilation of the Constitution of
21		Alabama of 1901, as amended, prohibits a general
22		law whose purpose or effect would be to require a
23		new or increased expenditure of local funds from
24		becoming effective with regard to a local
25		governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote
26		unless: it comes within one of a number of

specified exceptions; it is approved by the

affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates
funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to
the entity for the purpose.

The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment.

However, the bill does not require approval of a local governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective because it comes within one of the specified exceptions contained in the amendment.

Relating to crimes and offenses; to amend Section 13A-10-52, Code of Alabama 1975, to revise the criminal penalties for a violation of attempting to elude; and in connection therewith would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 13A-10-52, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:

3 "\$13A-10-52.

- "(a) It shall be unlawful for a person to intentionally flee by any means from anyone the person knows to be a law enforcement officer if the person knows the officer is attempting to arrest the person.
- "(b) It shall be unlawful for a person while operating a motor vehicle on a street, road, alley, or highway in this state, to intentionally flee or attempt to elude a law enforcement officer after having received a signal from the officer to bring the vehicle to a stop.
- "(c) A violation of subsection (a) or (b) is a Class A misdemeanor C felony unless the flight or attempt to elude causes an actual death or physical injury to innocent by standers or third parties, in which case the violation shall be a Class $\frac{1}{2}$ B felony. In addition, the court shall order the suspension of the driver's license of the defendant for a period of not less than six months nor more than two years."

Section 2. Although this bill would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements and application under Amendment 621, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an existing crime.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
