14	Section 1. Section 36-25-15, Code of Alabama 1975,
15	is amended to read as follows:

17	"(a) Candidates at every level of government shall
18	file a completed statement of economic interests for the
19	previous calendar year with the State Ethics Commission
20	simultaneously with the date such not more than five days
21	after the candidate files his or her qualifying papers with
22	the appropriate election official or in the case of an
23	independent candidate, not more than five days after the date
24	the person complies with the requirements of Section 17-9-3.
25	Nothing in this section shall be deemed to require a second
26	filing of the person's statement of economic interests if a

1 current statement of economic interests is on file with the 2 commission.

"(b) Each election official who receives a 3 declaration of candidacy or petition to appear on the ballot 4 5 for election from a candidate shall, within five days of the receipt, notify the commission of the name of the candidate, 6 7 as defined in this chapter, and the date on which the person became a candidate. The commission shall, within five business 8 9 days of receipt of such notification, notify the election 10 official whether the candidate has complied with the provisions of this section. 11

"(c) Other provisions of the law notwithstanding, if 12 13 a candidate does not submit a statement of economic interests or when applicable, an amended statement of economic interests 14 in accordance with the requirements of this chapter, the name 15 16 of the person shall not appear on the ballot and the candidate 17 shall be deemed not qualified as a candidate in that election. 18 Notwithstanding the foregoing, the commission may, for good cause shown, allow the candidate an additional five days to 19 20 file such statement of economic interests. If a candidate is 21 deemed not qualified, the appropriate election official shall remove the name of the candidate from the ballot." 22

23 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 24 first day of the third month following its passage and 25 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
