# A BILL

- To amend title 38, United States Code, to direct the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to establish within the Department of Veterans Affairs a center of excellence in the prevention, diagnosis, mitigation, treatment, and rehabilitation of health conditions relating to exposure to burn pits.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Helping Veterans Ex-

5 posed to Burn Pits Act".

1 SEC. 2. ESTABLISHMENT OF CENTER OF EXCELLENCE IN 2 **PREVENTION.** DIAGNOSIS, **MITIGATION**, 3 TREATMENT, AND REHABILITATION OF 4 HEALTH CONDITIONS RELATING TO EXPO-5 SURE TO BURN PITS AND OTHER ENVIRON-6 MENTAL EXPOSURES. 7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter II of chapter 73 of 8 title 38, United States Code, is amended by adding at the 9 end the following new section: 10 "§7330C. Center of excellence in prevention, diag-11 nosis, mitigation, treatment, and rehabili-12 tation of health conditions relating to ex-13 posure to burn pits and other environ-14 mental exposures 15 "(a) ESTABLISHMENT.—(1) The Secretary shall es-16 tablish within the Department a center of excellence in 17 the prevention, diagnosis, mitigation, treatment, and rehabilitation of health conditions relating to exposure to burn 18 19 pits and other environmental exposures to carry out the responsibilities specified in subsection (d). 20 21 "(2) The Secretary shall establish the center of excel-22 lence under paragraph (1) through the use of— 23 "(A) the directives and policies of the Depart-24 ment in effect as of the date of the enactment of the 25 Helping Veterans Exposed to Burn Pits Act;

1 "(B) the recommendations of the Comptroller 2 General of the United States and Inspector General 3 of the Department in effect as of such date; and "(C) guidance issued by the Secretary of De-4 5 fense under section 313 of the National Defense Au-6 thorization Act for Fiscal Year 2013 (Public Law 112-239; 10 U.S.C. 1074 note). 7 "(b) SELECTION OF SITE.—In selecting the site for 8 9 the center of excellence established under subsection (a), the Secretary shall consider entities that— 10 "(1) are equipped with the specialized equip-11 12 ment needed to study, diagnose, and treat health 13 conditions relating to exposure to burn pits and 14 other environmental exposures; "(2) have a track record of publishing informa-15 16 tion relating to post-deployment health exposures 17 among veterans who served in the Armed Forces in 18 support of Operation Iraqi Freedom and Operation 19 Enduring Freedom; 20 "(3) have access to animal models and in vitro models of dust immunology and lung injury con-21 22 sistent with the injuries of members of the Armed 23 Forces who served in support of Operation Iraqi 24 Freedom and Operation Enduring Freedom; and

"(4) have expertise in allergy, immunology, and
 pulmonary diseases.

"(c) COLLABORATION.—The Secretary shall ensure
that the center of excellence collaborates, to the maximum
extent practicable, with the Secretary of Defense, institutions of higher education, and other appropriate public
and private entities (including international entities) to
carry out the responsibilities specified in subsection (d).
"(d) RESPONSIBILITIES.—The center of excellence

10 shall have the following responsibilities:

"(1) To provide for the development, testing,
and dissemination within the Department of best
practices for the treatment of health conditions relating to exposure to burn pits and other environmental exposures.

"(2) To provide guidance for the health systems
of the Department and the Department of Defense
in determining the personnel required to provide
quality health care for members of the Armed
Forces and veterans with health conditions relating
to exposure to burn pits and other environmental exposures.

23 "(3) To establish, implement, and oversee a
24 comprehensive program to train health professionals
25 of the Department and the Department of Defense

in the treatment of health conditions relating to exposure to burn pits and other environmental exposures.

4 "(4) To facilitate advancements in the study of
5 the short-term and long-term effects of exposure to
6 burn pits and other environmental exposures.

7 "(5) To disseminate within medical facilities of
8 the Department best practices for training health
9 professionals with respect to health conditions relat10 ing to exposure to burn pits and other environmental
11 exposures.

12 "(6) To conduct basic science and translational 13 research on health conditions relating to exposure to 14 burn pits and other environmental exposures for the 15 purposes of understanding the etiology of such con-16 ditions and developing preventive interventions and 17 new treatments.

18 "(7) To provide medical treatment to veterans 19 diagnosed with medical conditions specific to expo-20 sure to burn pits and other environmental exposures. "(e) USE OF BURN PITS REGISTRY DATA.—In car-21 22 rying out its responsibilities under subsection (d), the cen-23 ter of excellence shall have access to and make use of the 24 data accumulated by the burn pits registry established under section 201 of the Dignified Burial and Other Vet-25

erans' Benefits Improvement Act of 2012 (Public Law
 112–260; 38 U.S.C. 527 note).

3 "(f) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

4 "(1) The term 'burn pit' means an area of land
5 located in Afghanistan or Iraq that—

6 "(A) is designated by the Secretary of De7 fense to be used for disposing solid waste by
8 burning in the outdoor air; and

9 "(B) does not contain a commercially man10 ufactured incinerator or other equipment spe11 cifically designed and manufactured for the
12 burning of solid waste.

"(2) The term 'other environmental exposures'
means exposure to environmental hazards, including
burn pits, dust or sand, hazardous materials, and
waste at any site in Afghanistan or Iraq that emits
smoke containing pollutants present in the environment or smoke from fires or explosions.

"(g) FUNDING.—(1) There is authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section \$4,100,000 for each of
the first five fiscal years beginning after the date of the
enactment of the Helping Veterans Exposed to Burn Pits
Act.

24 "(2) The Secretary may award additional amounts on25 a competitive basis to the center of excellence from the

medical and prosthetics research account of the Depart ment for the purpose of conducting research under this
 section relating to clinical and scientific investigation.".

- 4 (b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
  5 at the beginning of chapter 73 of such title is amended
  6 by inserting after the item relating to section 7330B the
- 7 following new item:
  - "7330C. Center of excellence in prevention, diagnosis, mitigation, treatment, and rehabilitation of health conditions relating to exposure to burn pits and other environmental exposures.".
