AN ACT concerning
Election Law - Party and Elected Public Offices - Prohibitions
FOR the purpose of providing that certain provisions of law do not apply to certain individuals; prohibiting individuals from simultaneously being a candidate for a party office and a an elected public office; prohibiting individuals from simultaneously holding a party office and a an elected public office; making clarifying changes; providing for a delayed effective date; and generally relating to simultaneous candidacy for and incumbency in more than one office.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Election Law
5-204.

(A) THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO AN INDIVIDUAL WHO SIMULTANEOUSLY HOLDS AN ELECTED PUBLIC OFFICE AND IS ON THE BALLOT FOR THE NATIONAL PRESIDENTIAL NOMINATING CONVENTION.
(\#) (B) An individual simultaneously may not be a candidate for more than one ELECTED public office.
(b) (C) An individual simultaneously may not be a candidate for more than one office of a political party.
(e) (D) Unless otherwise prohibited by rule of the applicable political party, an] AN individual simultaneously may NOT be a candidate for a party office and a AN ELECTED public office.
(D) (E) AN INDIVIDUAL SIMULTANEOUSLY MAY NOT HOLD A PARTY OFFICE AND A AN ELECTED PUBLIC OFFICE.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect January 1, 2021.
