AN ACT

To require the Secretary of Health and Human Services to disseminate information, resources, and if requested, technical assistance to early childhood care and education providers and professionals working with young children on ways to properly recognize and respond to children who may be impacted by trauma related to substance abuse. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Recognizing Early
5 Childhood Trauma Related to Substance Abuse Act of
6 2018".

7 SEC. 2. RECOGNIZING EARLY CHILDHOOD TRAUMA RE8 LATED TO SUBSTANCE ABUSE.

9 (a) DISSEMINATION OF INFORMATION.—The Sec-10 retary of Health and Human Services shall disseminate 11 information, resources, and, if requested, technical assist-12 ance to early childhood care and education providers and 13 professionals working with young children on—

14 (1) ways to properly recognize children who
15 may be impacted by trauma related to substance
16 abuse by a family member or other adult; and

17 (2) how to respond appropriately in order to
18 provide for the safety and well-being of young chil19 dren and their families.

20 (b) GOALS.—The information, resources, and tech21 nical assistance provided under subsection (a) shall—

(1) educate early childhood care and education
providers and professionals working with young children on understanding and identifying the early
signs and risk factors of children who might be im-

pacted by trauma due to exposure to substance
 abuse;

3 (2) suggest age-appropriate communication
4 tools, procedures, and practices for trauma-informed
5 care, including ways to prevent or mitigate the ef6 fects of trauma;

7 (3) provide options for responding to children
8 impacted by trauma due to exposure to substance
9 abuse that consider the needs of the child and fam10 ily, including recommending resources and referrals
11 for evidence-based services to support such family;
12 and

(4) promote whole-family and multigenerational approaches to prevent separation and
support re-unification of families whenever possible
and in the best interest of the child.

17 (c) RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.—Such information, re18 sources, and if applicable, technical assistance, shall not
19 be construed to amend the requirements under—

20 (1) the Child Care and Development Block
21 Grant Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. 9858 et seq.);

22 (2) the Head Start Act (42 U.S.C. 9831 et
23 seq.); or

(3) the Individuals with Disabilities Education
 Act (20 U.S.C. 1400 et seq.).
