SECTION 1.(e) Notwithstanding G.S. 115C-562.3(a), as enacted	by this act, as part
of a student's application for a scholarship grant pursuant to Part 2A of Ar	

1 115C of the General Statutes for the 2024-2025 school year, a parent shall certify to the State 2 Education Assistance Authority that the domicile requirements of G.S. 115C-562.1(3a), as 3 enacted by this act, are met for eligibility purposes in lieu of submitting evidence electronically 4 to the State Education Assistance Authority through a domicile determination system. The State 5 Education Assistance Authority shall select six percent (6%) of the applications for the 6 2024-2025 school year to verify the domicile requirements are met for the award of a scholarship 7 grant to an eligible student. As evidence of domicile, the State Education Assistance Authority 8 may accept the submission of any of the documents set forth under G.S. 115C-562.3(a). If a 9 parent fails to cooperate with verification efforts under this section, the State Education 10 Assistance Authority shall revoke the award of the scholarship grant to the eligible student. In 11 addition, if the State Education Assistance Authority determines that the certification of the 12 parent contains falsified information, the parent may be subject to administrative, civil, or 13 criminal penalties. The State Education Assistance Authority shall include a notice of the 14 potential for the imposition of penalties when requesting certification as part of the application 15 process.

16 **SECTION 1.(f)** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Opportunity 17 Scholarship Grant Fund the sum of two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) in 18 nonrecurring funds for the 2023-2024 fiscal year to be used by the State Education Assistance 19 Authority for the purposes of verification as required by subsection (e) of this section.

21 PART II. EFFECTIVE DATE

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SECTION 2. This act is effective July 1, 2023, and applies to applications for scholarship grants beginning with the 2024-2025 school year.
