- 2 (2) THE OWNER OF A CLASS A (PASSENGER) ZERO-EMISSION
- 3 ELECTRIC VEHICLE MAY APPLY TO THE ADMINISTRATION FOR AN ALTERNATIVE

- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
- 23 1, 2022. It shall remain effective for a period of 6 years and, at the end of June 30, 2028,
- 24 this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and
- 25 of no further force and effect.
