1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Vehicle Laws – Pilot Program to Evaluate Alternative Registration Plates and**
3 **Cards**

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Motor Vehicle Administration to conduct a pilot
5 program to evaluate the use of alternative vehicle registration plates and cards for
6 certain electric vehicles; and generally relating to alternative vehicle registration
7 plates and cards.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
14 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article – Transportation**

16 **13–619.4.**

17 **(A) (1) THE ADMINISTRATION MAY ESTABLISH A PILOT PROGRAM TO**
18 **EVALUATE THE USE OF ALTERNATIVES TO THE VEHICLE REGISTRATION PLATES AND**
19 **CARDS THAT ARE OTHERWISE REQUIRED UNDER THIS TITLE.**

20 **(2) SUBSECTIONS (B) THROUGH (D) OF THIS SECTION APPLY ONLY IF**
21 **THE ADMINISTRATION ESTABLISHES A PILOT PROGRAM UNDER THIS SUBSECTION.**

22 **(B) (1) THE ADMINISTRATION, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE**
23 **DEPARTMENT OF STATE POLICE, SHALL DEVELOP AND MAKE AVAILABLE**

1 ALTERNATIVES TO TRADITIONAL VEHICLE REGISTRATION PLATES AND CARDS.

2 (2) THE OWNER OF A CLASS A (PASSENGER) ZERO-EMISSION
3 ELECTRIC VEHICLE MAY APPLY TO THE ADMINISTRATION FOR AN ALTERNATIVE
4 VEHICLE REGISTRATION PLATE AND CARD.

5 (3) NOT MORE THAN 0.5% OF CLASS A (PASSENGER) ZERO-EMISSION
6 ELECTRIC VEHICLES REGISTERED IN THE STATE MAY PARTICIPATE IN THE PILOT
7 PROGRAM.

8 (4) THE ADMINISTRATION MAY NOT REQUIRE A ZERO-EMISSION
9 ELECTRIC VEHICLE OWNER TO PARTICIPATE IN THE PILOT PROGRAM.

10 (C) THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL COMPLETE THE PILOT PROGRAM BY JULY
11 1, 2027.

12 (D) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1, 2027, THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL
13 REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1257 OF THE STATE
14 GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE SENATE JUDICIAL PROCEEDINGS COMMITTEE AND
15 THE HOUSE ENVIRONMENT AND TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE ON THE RESULTS
16 OF THE PILOT PROGRAM, INCLUDING:

17 (1) AN EVALUATION OF COST-EFFECTIVENESS OF THE ALTERNATIVE
18 VEHICLE REGISTRATION PLATES AND CARDS COMPARED TO TRADITIONAL VEHICLE
19 REGISTRATION PLATES AND CARDS; AND

20 (2) RECOMMENDATIONS FOR ANY LEGISLATIVE OR REGULATORY
21 CHANGES NECESSARY BASED ON THE FINDINGS OF THE PILOT PROGRAM.

22 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
23 1, 2022. It shall remain effective for a period of 6 years and, at the end of June 30, 2028,
24 this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and
25 of no further force and effect.
