1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Vehicle Laws – Causing Diesel Emissions to Discharge Onto Another –**
3 **Prohibition**

4 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from causing a diesel-powered motor vehicle to
5 emit certain clearly visible emissions onto another person or motor vehicle; providing
6 for the application of this Act; and generally relating to a prohibition on the discharge
7 of excess diesel-powered motor vehicle emissions.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
14 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article – Transportation**

16 **21-1130.**

17 **(A) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, A PERSON**
18 **MAY NOT KNOWINGLY OR INTENTIONALLY CAUSE A DIESEL-POWERED MOTOR**

1 VEHICLE TO DISCHARGE CLEARLY VISIBLE SMOKE, SOOT, OR OTHER EXHAUST
2 EMISSIONS ONTO ANOTHER PERSON OR MOTOR VEHICLE.

3 (B) THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO A PERSON OPERATING:

4 (1) A DIESEL-POWERED VEHICLE THAT DISCHARGES VISIBLE
5 EXHAUST AS THE RESULT OF NORMAL ACCELERATION OR TOWING;

6 (2) A COMMERCIAL VEHICLE WITH A GROSS WEIGHT OF 10,000
7 POUNDS OR MORE; OR

8 (3) A CONSTRUCTION VEHICLE OPERATING AT A CONSTRUCTION
9 SITE.

10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
11 October 1, 2017.
