BY adding to Article – Transportation Section 21-1130 Annotated Code of Maryland (2012 Replacement Volume and 2016 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Transportation 21–1130. (A) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, A PERSON MAY NOT KNOWINGLY OR INTENTIONALLY CAUSE A DIESEL-POWERED MOTOR
