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AN ACT relating to the Advisory Council for Medical Assistance.

2 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

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→ Section 1. KRS 205.540 is amended to read as follows:

4 (1)An Advisory Council for Medical Assistance shall be established in the state 5 government. The council shall consist of *twenty (20)*[nineteen (19) members]. The 6 secretary for health and family services shall be an ex officio member. The other 7 *nineteen* (19)[eighteen (18)] members of the council shall be appointed by the 8 Governor and shall hold office for a term of four (4) years and until their successors 9 are appointed and qualify, except that the members appointed to fill the first 10 vacancy occurring for a term beginning on July 1, 1960, shall be as follows: Two 11 (2) members shall be appointed for one (1) year, two (2) for two (2) years, two (2) 12 for three (3) years, and three (3) for four (4) years, and the respective terms of the 13 first members shall be designated by the Governor at the time of their appointments. 14 Upon the expiration of the respective terms of the members first appointed, the term 15 of each successor shall be for four (4) years and until his successor is appointed and 16 qualified. Ten (10) of the appointments shall be made one (1) from each list of three 17 (3) nominees submitted by the following organizations: the Kentucky State Medical 18 Association; the Kentucky Dental Association; the Kentucky Hospital Association; 19 the Kentucky Medical Equipment Suppliers Association; the Kentucky Pharmacists 20 Association; the Kentucky Association of Health Care Facilities; the Kentucky 21 Nurses' Association; the State Board of Podiatry; the Kentucky Home Health 22 Association; the Kentucky Optometric Association; and the Kentucky Association 23 of Nonprofit Homes and Services for the Aging, Inc. The other *eight (8)*[seven (7)] 24 appointive members shall be health-care advocates knowledgeable about health care 25 and the health-care industry, and shall include three (3) medical assistance 26 recipients, one (1) representative of a recognized consumer advocacy group 27 representing the elderly; one (1) representative of a recognized consumer advocacy

- 1 group representing persons reentering society following incarceration; and three 2 (3) representatives of recognized consumer advocacy groups whose membership 3 includes low-income persons, children and youth, women, minorities, and disabled 4 persons. 5 (2)Each appointive member of the council shall serve without compensation but each 6 council member not otherwise compensated for his time or expenses shall be 7 entitled to reimbursement for his actual and necessary expenses in carrying out his 8 duties with reimbursement for expenses being made in accordance with state 9 regulations relating to travel reimbursement. Vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired term in the same manner as original 10 (3) 11 appointments, maintaining representations as set out in subsection (1) of this 12 section. 13 (4) The council shall elect a chairman, vice chairman, and secretary from among its 14 members at its first regular meeting in each fiscal year and shall adopt rules 15 governing its proceedings. The council shall hold a meeting at least once every three 16 (3) months and such other special or regular meetings as may be desired. 17 No consumer member of the council shall have a fiduciary relationship or interest in (5) 18 any health-care facility or service. 19 → Section 2. KRS 205.590 is amended to read as follows: 20 (1)The following technical advisory committees shall be established for the purpose of 21 acting in an advisory capacity to the Advisory Council for Medical 22 Assistance[council] with respect to the administration of the medical assistance 23 program and in performing the function of peer review: 24 A Technical Advisory Committee on Physician Services consisting of five (5) (a) 25 physicians appointed by the council of the Kentucky State Medical 26 Association:

15	(g)	A Technical Advisory Committee on Podiatric Care consisting of five (5)
16		podiatrists appointed by the Kentucky Podiatry Association;
17	(h)	A Technical Advisory Committee on Primary Care consisting of five (5)
18		primary care providers, two (2) of whom shall represent licensed health
19		maintenance organizations, appointed by the Governor, until such time as an
20		association of primary care providers is established, whereafter the association
21		shall appoint the members;
22	(i)	A Technical Advisory Committee on Home Health Care consisting of five (5)
23		members appointed by the board of directors of the Kentucky Home Health
24		Association;
25	(j)	A Technical Advisory Committee on Consumer Rights and Client Needs
26		consisting of five (5) members, with one (1) member to be appointed by each
27		of the following organizations: the Kentucky Combined Committee on Aging,

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the Kentucky Legal Services Corporation, the Arc of Kentucky, the Department of Public Advocacy, and the National Association of Social Workers-Kentucky Chapter;

- 4 (k) A Technical Advisory Committee on Behavioral Health consisting of six (6)
 5 members, with one (1) member to be appointed by each of the following
 6 organizations: the Kentucky Mental Health Coalition, the Kentucky
 7 Association of Regional Programs, the National Alliance on Mental Illness
 8 (NAMI) Kentucky, a statewide mental health consumer organization, the
 9 People Advocating Recovery (PAR), and the Kentucky Brain Injury Alliance;
- 10 A Technical Advisory Committee on Children's Health consisting of ten (10) (1)members, with one (1) member to be appointed by each of the following 11 12 organizations: the Kentucky Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics, 13 the Kentucky PTA, the Kentucky Psychological Association, the Kentucky 14 School Nurses Association, the Kentucky Association for Early Childhood 15 Education, the Family Resource and Youth Services Coalition of Kentucky, 16 the Kentucky Youth Advocates, the Kentucky Association of Hospice and 17 Palliative Care, a parent of a child enrolled in Medicaid or the Kentucky Children's Health Insurance Program appointed by the Kentucky Head Start 18 19 Association, and a pediatric dentist appointed by the Kentucky Dental 20 Association:
- (m) A Technical Advisory Committee on Intellectual and Developmental
 Disabilities consisting of nine (9) members, one (1) of whom shall be a
 consumer who participates in a nonresidential community Medicaid waiver
 program, one (1) of whom shall be a consumer who participates in a
 residential community Medicaid waiver program, one (1) of whom shall be a
 consumer representative of a family member who participates in a community
 Medicaid waiver program, and one (1) of whom shall be a consumer

1		representative of a family member who resides in an ICF/ID facility that
2		accepts Medicaid payments, all of whom shall be appointed by the Governor;
3		one (1) member shall be appointed by the Arc of Kentucky; one (1) member
4		shall be appointed by the Commonwealth Council on Developmental
5		Disabilities; one (1) member shall be appointed by the Kentucky Association
6		of Homes and Services for the Aging; and two (2) members shall be appointed
7		by the Kentucky Association of Private Providers, one (1) of whom shall be a
8		nonprofit provider and one (1) of whom shall be a for-profit provider;
9	(n)	A Technical Advisory Committee on Therapy Services consisting of six (6)
10		members, two (2) of whom shall be occupational therapists and shall be
11		appointed by the Kentucky Occupational Therapists Association, two (2) of
12		whom shall be physical therapists and shall be appointed by the Kentucky
13		Physical Therapy Association, and two (2) of whom shall be speech therapists
14		and shall be appointed by the Kentucky Speech-Language-Hearing
15		Association;[and]
16	(0)	A Technical Advisory Committee on Pharmacy consisting of five (5)
17		pharmacists appointed by the Kentucky Pharmacists Association: and
18	<u>(p)</u>	A Technical Advisory Committee on Persons Returning to Society from
19		Incarceration consisting of twelve (12) members of whom:
20		1. One (1) shall be appointed by each of the following organizations: the
21		Kentucky Jailers Association, the Kentucky Medical Association, the
22		Kentucky Association of Nurse Practitioners and Nurse-Midwives,
23		Community Action of Kentucky, the Homeless and Housing Coalition
24		of Kentucky, the Kentucky Office of Drug Control Policy, a Kentucky
25		civil legal aid program, the Kentucky Department of Corrections, the
26		Kentucky Department of Public Advocacy, the Kentucky Association
27		of Regional Programs, the Kentucky Administrative Office of the

1		Courts; and
2		2. One (1) formerly incarcerated individual who is a current or former
3		Medicaid recipient shall be appointed by Mental Health America of
4		<u>Kentucky</u> .
5	(2)	The members of the technical advisory committees shall serve until their successors
6		are appointed and qualified.
7	(3)	Each appointive member of a committee shall serve without compensation but shall
8		be entitled to reimbursement for actual and necessary expenses in carrying out his
9		duties with reimbursement for expenses being made in accordance with state
10		regulations relating to travel reimbursement.
