9 13.1), which relates to required service of minimum  
10 percentage of sentence; modifying inclusions; amending  
11 21 O.S. 2011, Section 644, as last amended by Section 1,  
12 Chapter 200, O.S.L. 2019 (21 O.S. Supp. 2019, Section  
13 644), which relates to assault, assault and battery and  
14 domestic abuse; modifying certain offense; modifying  
15 certain penalty; amending 57 O.S. 2011, Section 571, as  
16 last amended by Section 1, Chapter 152, O.S.L. 2019 (57  
17 O.S. Supp. 2019, Section 571), which relates to  
18 definitions; modifying inclusions; and providing an  
19 effective date.

20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

21 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 13.1, as  
22 last amended by Section 1, Chapter 290, O.S.L. 2015 (21 O.S. Supp.  
23 2019, Section 13.1), is amended to read as follows:

24 Section 13.1. Persons convicted of:

1. First degree murder as defined in Section 701.7 of this  
title;

2. Second degree murder as defined by Section 701.8 of this  
title;

14 20. Aggravated trafficking as provided for in subsection C of  
15 Section 2-415 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

16 21. Aggravated assault and battery upon any person defending  
17 another person from assault and battery; ~~or~~

18 22. Human trafficking as provided for in Section 748 of this  
19 title;

20 23. Domestic assault and battery that results in great bodily  
21 injury to the victim as provided for in Section 644 of this title;  
22 or

23 24. Domestic assault and battery against a pregnant woman with  
24 knowledge of pregnancy and a miscarriage occurs as a result of the

1 assault or injury to the unborn child occurs as a result of the  
2 assault, as provided for in Section 644 of this title,  
3 shall be required to serve not less than eighty-five percent (85%)  
4 of any sentence of imprisonment imposed by the judicial system prior  
5 to becoming eligible for consideration for parole. Persons  
6 convicted of these offenses shall not be eligible for earned credits  
7 or any other type of credits which have the effect of reducing the  
8 length of the sentence to less than eighty-five percent (85%) of the  
9 sentence imposed.

10 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 644, as last  
11 amended by Section 1, Chapter 200, O.S.L. 2019 (21 O.S. Supp. 2019,  
12 Section 644), is amended to read as follows:

13 Section 644. A. Assault shall be punishable by imprisonment in  
14 a county jail not exceeding thirty (30) days, or by a fine of not  
15 more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or by both such fine and  
16 imprisonment.

17 B. Assault and battery shall be punishable by imprisonment in a  
18 county jail not exceeding ninety (90) days, or by a fine of not more  
19 than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), or by both such fine and  
20 imprisonment.

21 C. Any person who commits any assault and battery against a  
22 current or former intimate partner or a family or household member  
23 as defined by Section 60.1 of Title 22 of the Oklahoma Statutes  
24 shall be guilty of domestic abuse. Upon conviction, the defendant

1 shall be punished by imprisonment in the county jail for not more  
2 than one (1) year, or by a fine not exceeding Five Thousand Dollars  
3 (\$5,000.00), or by both such fine and imprisonment. Upon conviction  
4 for a second or subsequent offense, the person shall be punished by  
5 imprisonment in the custody of the Department of Corrections for not  
6 more than four (4) years, or by a fine not exceeding Five Thousand  
7 Dollars (\$5,000.00), or by both such fine and imprisonment. The  
8 provisions of Section 51.1 of this title shall apply to any second  
9 or subsequent offense.

10 D. 1. Any person who, with intent to do bodily harm and  
11 without justifiable or excusable cause, commits any assault,  
12 battery, or assault and battery upon an intimate partner or a family  
13 or household member as defined by Section 60.1 of Title 22 of the  
14 Oklahoma Statutes with any sharp or dangerous weapon, upon  
15 conviction, is guilty of domestic assault or domestic assault and  
16 battery with a dangerous weapon which shall be a felony and  
17 punishable by imprisonment in the custody of the Department of  
18 Corrections not exceeding ten (10) years, or by imprisonment in a  
19 county jail not exceeding one (1) year. The provisions of Section  
20 51.1 of this title shall apply to any second or subsequent  
21 conviction for a violation of this paragraph.

22 2. Any person who, without such cause, shoots an intimate  
23 partner or a family or household member as defined by Section 60.1  
24 of Title 22 of the Oklahoma Statutes by means of any deadly weapon

1 that is likely to produce death shall, upon conviction, be guilty of  
2 domestic assault and battery with a deadly weapon which shall be a  
3 felony punishable by imprisonment in the custody of the Department  
4 of Corrections not exceeding life. The provisions of Section 51.1  
5 of this title shall apply to any second or subsequent conviction for  
6 a violation of this paragraph.

7 E. Any person convicted of domestic abuse committed against a  
8 pregnant woman with knowledge of the pregnancy shall be guilty of a  
9 misdemeanor, punishable by imprisonment in the county jail for not  
10 more than one (1) year.

11 Any person convicted of a second or subsequent offense of  
12 domestic abuse against a pregnant woman with knowledge of the  
13 pregnancy shall be guilty of a felony, punishable by imprisonment in  
14 the custody of the Department of Corrections for not less than ten  
15 (10) years.

16 Any person convicted of domestic abuse committed against a  
17 pregnant woman with knowledge of the pregnancy and a miscarriage  
18 occurs or injury to the unborn child occurs shall be guilty of a  
19 felony, punishable by imprisonment in the custody of the Department  
20 of Corrections for not less than twenty (20) years.

21 F. Any person convicted of domestic abuse as defined in  
22 subsection C of this section that results in great bodily injury to  
23 the victim shall be guilty of a felony and punished by imprisonment  
24 in the custody of the Department of Corrections for not more than

1 ten (10) years, ~~or by imprisonment in the county jail for not more~~  
2 ~~than one (1) year.~~ The provisions of Section 51.1 of this title  
3 shall apply to any second or subsequent conviction of a violation of  
4 this subsection.

5 G. Any person convicted of domestic abuse as defined in  
6 subsection C of this section that was committed in the presence of a  
7 child shall be punished by imprisonment in the county jail for not  
8 less than six (6) months nor more than one (1) year, or by a fine  
9 not exceeding Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00), or by both such  
10 fine and imprisonment. Any person convicted of a second or  
11 subsequent domestic abuse as defined in subsection C of this section  
12 that was committed in the presence of a child shall be punished by  
13 imprisonment in the custody of the Department of Corrections for not  
14 less than one (1) year nor more than five (5) years, or by a fine  
15 not exceeding Seven Thousand Dollars (\$7,000.00), or by both such  
16 fine and imprisonment. The provisions of Section 51.1 of this title  
17 shall apply to any second or subsequent offense. For every  
18 conviction of a domestic abuse crime in violation of any provision  
19 of this section committed against an intimate partner or a family or  
20 household member as defined by Section 60.1 of Title 22 of the  
21 Oklahoma Statutes, the court shall:

22 1. Specifically order as a condition of a suspended or deferred  
23 sentence that a defendant participate in counseling or undergo  
24

1 treatment to bring about the cessation of domestic abuse as  
2 specified in paragraph 2 of this subsection;

3       2.    a.    The court shall require the defendant to complete an  
4               assessment and follow the recommendations of a  
5               batterers' intervention program certified by the  
6               Attorney General. If the defendant is ordered to  
7               participate in a batterers' intervention program, the  
8               order shall require the defendant to attend the  
9               program for a minimum of fifty-two (52) weeks,  
10              complete the program, and be evaluated before and  
11              after attendance of the program by program staff.  
12              Three unexcused absences in succession or seven  
13              unexcused absences in a period of fifty-two (52) weeks  
14              from any court-ordered batterers' intervention program  
15              shall be prima facie evidence of the violation of the  
16              conditions of probation for the district attorney to  
17              seek acceleration or revocation of any probation  
18              entered by the court.

19        b.    A program for anger management, couples counseling, or  
20               family and marital counseling shall not solely qualify  
21               for the counseling or treatment requirement for  
22               domestic abuse pursuant to this subsection. The  
23               counseling may be ordered in addition to counseling  
24               specifically for the treatment of domestic abuse or



1 per evaluation as set forth below. If, after  
2 sufficient evaluation and attendance at required  
3 counseling sessions, the domestic violence treatment  
4 program or licensed professional determines that the  
5 defendant does not evaluate as a perpetrator of  
6 domestic violence or does evaluate as a perpetrator of  
7 domestic violence and should complete other programs  
8 of treatment simultaneously or prior to domestic  
9 violence treatment, including but not limited to  
10 programs related to the mental health, apparent  
11 substance or alcohol abuse or inability or refusal to  
12 manage anger, the defendant shall be ordered to  
13 complete the counseling as per the recommendations of  
14 the domestic violence treatment program or licensed  
15 professional;

- 16 3. a. The court shall set a review hearing no more than one  
17 hundred twenty (120) days after the defendant is  
18 ordered to participate in a domestic abuse counseling  
19 program or undergo treatment for domestic abuse to  
20 assure the attendance and compliance of the defendant  
21 with the provisions of this subsection and the  
22 domestic abuse counseling or treatment requirements.  
23 The court may suspend sentencing of the defendant  
24 until the defendant has presented proof to the court

1 of enrollment in a program of treatment for domestic  
2 abuse by an individual licensed practitioner or a  
3 domestic abuse treatment program certified by the  
4 Attorney General and attendance at weekly sessions of  
5 such program. Such proof shall be presented to the  
6 court by the defendant no later than one hundred  
7 twenty (120) days after the defendant is ordered to  
8 such counseling or treatment. At such time, the court  
9 may complete sentencing, beginning the period of the  
10 sentence from the date that proof of enrollment is  
11 presented to the court, and schedule reviews as  
12 required by subparagraphs a and b of this paragraph  
13 and paragraphs 4 and 5 of this subsection. Three  
14 unexcused absences in succession or seven unexcused  
15 absences in a period of fifty-two (52) weeks from any  
16 court-ordered domestic abuse counseling or treatment  
17 program shall be prima facie evidence of the violation  
18 of the conditions of probation for the district  
19 attorney to seek acceleration or revocation of any  
20 probation entered by the court.

21 b. The court shall set a second review hearing after the  
22 completion of the counseling or treatment to assure  
23 the attendance and compliance of the defendant with  
24 the provisions of this subsection and the domestic

1 abuse counseling or treatment requirements. The court  
2 shall retain continuing jurisdiction over the  
3 defendant during the course of ordered counseling  
4 through the final review hearing;

5 4. The court may set subsequent or other review hearings as the  
6 court determines necessary to assure the defendant attends and fully  
7 complies with the provisions of this subsection and the domestic  
8 abuse counseling or treatment requirements;

9 5. At any review hearing, if the defendant is not  
10 satisfactorily attending individual counseling or a domestic abuse  
11 counseling or treatment program or is not in compliance with any  
12 domestic abuse counseling or treatment requirements, the court may  
13 order the defendant to further or continue counseling, treatment, or  
14 other necessary services. The court may revoke all or any part of a  
15 suspended sentence, deferred sentence, or probation pursuant to  
16 Section 991b of Title 22 of the Oklahoma Statutes and subject the  
17 defendant to any or all remaining portions of the original sentence;

18 6. At the first review hearing, the court shall require the  
19 defendant to appear in court. Thereafter, for any subsequent review  
20 hearings, the court may accept a report on the progress of the  
21 defendant from individual counseling, domestic abuse counseling, or  
22 the treatment program. There shall be no requirement for the victim  
23 to attend review hearings; and  
24

1        7. If funding is available, a referee may be appointed and  
2 assigned by the presiding judge of the district court to hear  
3 designated cases set for review under this subsection. Reasonable  
4 compensation for the referees shall be fixed by the presiding judge.  
5 The referee shall meet the requirements and perform all duties in  
6 the same manner and procedure as set forth in Sections 1-8-103 and  
7 2-2-702 of Title 10A of the Oklahoma Statutes pertaining to referees  
8 appointed in juvenile proceedings.

9        The defendant may be required to pay all or part of the cost of  
10 the counseling or treatment, in the discretion of the court.

11        H. As used in subsection G of this section, "in the presence of  
12 a child" means in the physical presence of a child; or having  
13 knowledge that a child is present and may see or hear an act of  
14 domestic violence. For the purposes of subsections C and G of this  
15 section, "child" may be any child whether or not related to the  
16 victim or the defendant.

17        I. For the purposes of subsections C and G of this section, any  
18 conviction for assault and battery against an intimate partner or a  
19 family or household member as defined by Section 60.1 of Title 22 of  
20 the Oklahoma Statutes shall constitute a sufficient basis for a  
21 felony charge:

22        1. If that conviction is rendered in any state, county or  
23 parish court of record of this or any other state; or  
24

1        2. If that conviction is rendered in any municipal court of  
2 record of this or any other state for which any jail time was  
3 served; provided, no conviction in a municipal court of record  
4 entered prior to November 1, 1997, shall constitute a prior  
5 conviction for purposes of a felony charge.

6        J. Any person who commits any assault and battery with intent  
7 to cause great bodily harm by strangulation or attempted  
8 strangulation against an intimate partner or a family or household  
9 member as defined by Section 60.1 of Title 22 of the Oklahoma  
10 Statutes shall, upon conviction, be guilty of domestic abuse by  
11 strangulation and shall be punished by imprisonment in the custody  
12 of the Department of Corrections for a period of not less than one  
13 (1) year nor more than three (3) years, or by a fine of not more  
14 than Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00), or by both such fine and  
15 imprisonment. Upon a second or subsequent conviction for a  
16 violation of this section, the defendant shall be punished by  
17 imprisonment in the custody of the Department of Corrections for a  
18 period of not less than three (3) years nor more than ten (10)  
19 years, or by a fine of not more than Twenty Thousand Dollars  
20 (\$20,000.00), or by both such fine and imprisonment. The provisions  
21 of Section 51.1 of this title shall apply to any second or  
22 subsequent conviction of a violation of this subsection. As used in  
23 this subsection, "strangulation" means any form of asphyxia;  
24 including, but not limited to, asphyxia characterized by closure of

1 the blood vessels or air passages of the neck as a result of  
2 external pressure on the neck or the closure of the nostrils or  
3 mouth as a result of external pressure on the head.

4 K. Any district court of this state and any judge thereof shall  
5 be immune from any liability or prosecution for issuing an order  
6 that requires a defendant to:

7 1. Attend a treatment program for domestic abusers certified by  
8 the Attorney General;

9 2. Attend counseling or treatment services ordered as part of  
10 any suspended or deferred sentence or probation; and

11 3. Attend, complete, and be evaluated before and after  
12 attendance by a treatment program for domestic abusers, certified by  
13 the Attorney General.

14 L. There shall be no charge of fees or costs to any victim of  
15 domestic violence, stalking, or sexual assault in connection with  
16 the prosecution of a domestic violence, stalking, or sexual assault  
17 offense in this state.

18 M. In the course of prosecuting any charge of domestic abuse,  
19 stalking, harassment, rape, or violation of a protective order, the  
20 prosecutor shall provide the court, prior to sentencing or any plea  
21 agreement, a local history and any other available history of past  
22 convictions of the defendant within the last ten (10) years relating  
23 to domestic abuse, stalking, harassment, rape, violation of a  
24

1 protective order, or any other violent misdemeanor or felony  
2 convictions.

3 N. Any plea of guilty or finding of guilt for a violation of  
4 subsection C, F, G, I or J of this section shall constitute a  
5 conviction of the offense for the purpose of this act or any other  
6 criminal statute under which the existence of a prior conviction is  
7 relevant for a period of ten (10) years following the completion of  
8 any court imposed probationary term; provided, the person has not,  
9 in the meantime, been convicted of a misdemeanor involving moral  
10 turpitude or a felony.

11 O. For purposes of subsection F of this section, "great bodily  
12 injury" means bone fracture, protracted and obvious disfigurement,  
13 protracted loss or impairment of the function of a body part, organ  
14 or mental faculty, or substantial risk of death.

15 P. Any pleas of guilty or nolo contendere or finding of guilt  
16 to a violation of any provision of this section shall constitute a  
17 conviction of the offense for the purpose of any subsection of this  
18 section under which the existence of a prior conviction is relevant  
19 for a period of ten (10) years following the completion of any  
20 sentence or court imposed probationary term.

21 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 57 O.S. 2011, Section 571, as last

18           c. aggravated assault and battery on a police officer,  
19 sheriff, highway patrolman, or any other officer of  
20 the law, as provided for in Section 650 of Title 21 of  
21 the Oklahoma Statutes,

22           d. poisoning with intent to kill, as provided for in  
23 Section 651 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes,

- e. shooting with intent to kill, as provided for in

- f. assault with intent to kill, as provided for in
