BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - State Government 9 - 957. (a) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated. 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

(f) There is a Maryland Veterans Service Animal Program Fund. 1 (1) 2 The Department shall use revenue from the Fund to pay a nonprofit (2)3 training entity. 4 (3)Revenue from the Fund may be used only to pay: 5 (i) a nonprofit training entity; and 6 administrative costs of the Program. (ii) 7 (4) The Secretary, or the Secretary's designee, shall administer the Fund. 8 The Fund is a special, nonlapsing fund that is not subject to § (5)(i) 9 7–302 of the State Finance and Procurement Article. 10 (ii) The State Treasurer shall hold the Fund separately, and the 11 Comptroller shall account for the Fund.
