3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Jobs Court Pilot Program in the District Court; 4 establishing the purpose of the pilot program; requiring the Administrative Office of 5 the Courts to take certain actions to accomplish the purpose of the pilot program; 6 requiring the Administrative Office of the Courts to provide a certain report to the 7 Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain date; establishing the 8 creation of three Position Identification Numbers for a certain purpose; requiring the 9 Governor to make certain mandatory appropriations in a certain fiscal year; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the establishment 10 11 of the Jobs Court Pilot Program.

- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 18 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 21 (A) THERE IS A JOBS COURT PILOT PROGRAM IN THE DISTRICT COURT.
- 22 (B) THE PURPOSE OF THE PILOT PROGRAM IS TO REDUCE RECIDIVISM BY
- 23 OFFERING DEFENDANTS AN OPPORTUNITY TO PARTICIPATE IN FULL-TIME JOB
- 24 TRAINING AND JOB PLACEMENT PROGRAMS AS A CONDITION OF PROBATION OR AS



1 AN ALTERNATIVE TO INCARCERATION.

- 2 (C) TO ACCOMPLISH THE PURPOSE OF THE PILOT PROGRAM, THE 3 ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE OF THE COURTS SHALL:
- 4 (1) DEVELOP A PLAN TO IMPLEMENT THE PILOT PROGRAM; AND
- 5 (2) ESTABLISH PROCEDURES TO ASSIGN FUNDS TO THE DISTRICT 6 COURT FOR THE COUNTIES THAT PARTICIPATE IN THE PILOT PROGRAM.
- 7 (D) ON OR BEFORE JUNE 30, 2025, THE ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE OF THE 8 COURTS SHALL REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1257 9 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON THE 10 OPERATION AND RESULTS OF THE PILOT PROGRAM.
- 11 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:
- 12 (a) Three Position Identification Numbers (PINs) shall be created for the purpose of hiring social workers to assist in administering the pilot program.
- 14 (b) For fiscal year 2022, the Governor shall include in the annual State budget:
- 15 (1) an appropriation of at least \$250,000 to the Governor's Workforce 16 Investment Board, to be distributed to local workforce investment boards or other nonprofit 17 entities that participate in the pilot program by identifying employers and training 18 programs; and
- 19 (2) an appropriation of at least \$250,000 to the Administrative Office of the 20 Courts, to be assigned to the District Court for the counties, including Baltimore City, that 21 participate in the pilot program.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2020. It shall remain effective for a period of 5 years and, at the end of June 30, 2025, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
