SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 19Article Education
- $20 \quad 14-104.2.$

(a) The Board of Regents shall develop and implement a plan to enhance theOffice of Technology Transfer at the University.

(b) At the request of the Board of Regents, the Maryland Technology Development
 Corporation shall provide technical assistance to the Office of Technology Transfer.

1 (c) For each of fiscal years [2018] **2022** through [2020] **2025**, the Governor shall 2 include in the annual budget bill an appropriation of \$1,000,000 to the University to:

- (1) Enhance the Office of Technology Transfer; and

4 (2) Increase the capacity of the Office to move technology into the 5 marketplace.

6 (d) On or before December 1, 2016, and each year thereafter, the Board of Regents 7 shall report to the Governor and the General Assembly, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the 8 State Government Article, on the implementation of the plan to enhance the Office of 9 Technology Transfer and on the capacity of the Office to move technology into the 10 marketplace.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2016. It shall remain effective for a period [4] OF 9 years and, at the end of June 30, [2020] 2025, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
