AN ACT relating to worker's compensation; modifying the 1 rate discount for compliance with a drug and alcohol 2 testing program as specified; providing for an experience 3 modification rate for out of state employers moving 4 operations to Wyoming as specified; providing a premium 5 6 credit for employers as specified; providing for 7 rulemaking; and providing for an effective date. 8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 9 10 Section 1. W.S. 27-14-201(o)(intro) and 27-14-207 by 11 12 creating a new subsection (h) and by amending and renumbering (h) as (j) are amended to read: 13 14 15 27-14-201. Rates and classifications; rate surcharge.

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(o) The division shall in accordance with its rules 2 3 and regulations, grant a discount to rates established 4 under this section in an amount not to exceed ten percent (10%) of the base rate for the employment classification of 5 any employer if the employer complies with a safety program 6 approved by the division and a discount in an amount not to 7 8 exceed five percent (5%) ten percent (10%) of the base rate 9 for the employment classification if the employer complies 10 with a drug and alcohol testing program approved by the 11 division and a discount in an amount not to exceed ten 12 percent (10%) of the base rate for the employment 13 classification if the employer complies with a health and 14 safety consultation program developed by the department of 15 workforce services in consultation with the occupational 16 health and safety commission. In no instance shall the sum 17 total of discounts under this subsection exceed twenty-five 18 percent (25%) thirty percent (30%) of the base rate for the The discount 19 employment classification for the employer. 20 for the health and safety consultation program shall only 21 remain in effect for three (3) years after the employer is certified to be in compliance with the health and safety 22 23 consultation program recommendations. In determining safety

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program approval, drug and alcohol program approval, health 1 2 and safety consultation program approval and the total discount granted under this subsection, the division shall 3 4 consider: 5 6 27-14-207. Employer registration required; person acquiring trade of another employer; transfer of experience 7 8 and assignment of rates; out of state employers. 9 10 (h) Where an employer has not had prior operations in 11 Wyoming and has not had prior worker's compensation 12 insurance coverage in Wyoming, and moves or expands 13 operations from another state into Wyoming, and begins 14 operations that are the same or similar to operations 15 outside of Wyoming, the division shall assign the employer 16 experience modification rate as calculated per the current 17 experience modification rating formula in place at the 18 time. The division shall assign such experience 19 modification to the partial year ending June 30 after the 20 start of coverage in Wyoming and to the first full policy 21 year subsequent to the start of coverage in Wyoming.
