- Whereas the Framers intended that the First Amendment to the Constitution, in prohibiting the establishment of religion, would not prohibit any mention of religion or reference to God in civic dialogue: Now, therefore, be it
 - 1 *Resolved*, That the House of Representatives—

(1) recognizes the importance of the symbols
and traditions of Christmas;
(2) strongly disapproves of attempts to ban ref erences to Christmas; and
(3) expresses support for the use of these sym bols and traditions by those who celebrate Christ mas.
