- 3 → Section 1. KRS 511.100 is amended to read as follows:
- 4 (1) As used in this section:
- 5 (a) "Key infrastructure assets" means:
- 6 1. Any critical node of a system used in the production or generation of electrical
- 7 energy;
- 8 2. A petroleum refinery;
- 9 3. A rubber or hazardous chemical manufacturing facility;
- 4. A petroleum or hazardous chemical storage facility or terminal;
- 11 5. Natural gas processing, fractionation, stabilization, and compressor station
- 12 facilities, as well as above-ground *natural gas or petroleum* pipelines and related
- 13 facilities:
- 6. Railroad yards and railroad tunnel portals;
- 15 7. A drinking water collection, treatment, or storage facility;
- 16 8. Grounds or property of a state prison, juvenile justice facility, jail, or other
- 17 facility for the detention of persons charged with or convicted of crimes;
- 9. A facility used for research, development, design, production, delivery, or
- maintenance of military weapons systems, subsystems, and components or parts to meet
- 20 military requirements of the United States; [or]
- 21 10. A wireless communications facility, including the tower, antennae, support
- structures and all associated ground-based equipment, and a telecommunications central

- 4 (2) (a) A person commits the offense of trespass upon key infrastructure assets
- 5 if he or she knowingly enters or remains unlawfully in or upon real property on which key
- 6 infrastructure assets are located.
- 7 (b) A person commits the offense of trespass upon key infrastructure assets if he
- 8 or she knowingly uses, or retains or authorizes a person to use, an unmanned aircraft
- 9 system to fly above real property on which key infrastructure assets are located with the
- 10 intent to cause harm or damage to or conduct surveillance of the key infrastructure asset
- without the prior consent of the owner, tenant, or lessee of the real property.
- 12 (3) Trespass upon key infrastructure assets is a Class B misdemeanor for the first

- 3 (d) Operation of an unmanned aircraft system by a person or entity for a 4 commercial purpose in compliance with applicable Federal Aviation Administration 5 authorization, regulations, or exemptions;
- 6 (e) A satellite orbiting the earth;
- 7 (f) An unmanned aircraft system used by an insurance company or a person 8 acting on behalf of an insurance company for purposes of underwriting an insurance risk 9 or investigating damage to insured property; or
- 10 (g) An unmanned aircraft system used strictly in accordance with an order of a court of competent jurisdiction.
- → Section 2. KRS 512.020 is amended to read as follows:
- 13 (1) A person is guilty of criminal mischief in the first degree when, having no 14 right to do so or any reasonable ground to believe that he <u>or she</u> has such right, he <u>or she</u> 15 intentionally or wantonly:
- 16 (a) Defaces, destroys, or damages any property causing pecuniary loss of \$1,000 or more; or
- 18 (b) Tampers with the operations of a key infrastructure asset, as defined in 19 Section 1 of this Act, in a manner that renders the operations harmful or dangerous.
- 20 (2) Criminal mischief in the first degree is a Class D felony.
- 21 → SECTION 3. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 411 IS CREATED TO
  22 READ AS FOLLOWS:
- A civil action may be maintained under this section against any person that

  knowingly directs or causes a person to violate subsection (1)(b) of Section 2 of this
- 25 Act. Liability shall include actual damages to personal or real property caused by the
- 26 <u>offense and may include punitive damages and court costs.</u>
