A BILL

- To designate the same individual serving as the Chief Nurse Officer of the Public Health Service as the National Nurse for Public Health.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "National Nurse Act3 of 2019".

4 SEC. 2. NATIONAL NURSE FOR PUBLIC HEALTH.

5 Title XVII of the Public Health Service Act (42
6 U.S.C. 300u et seq.) is amended by adding at the end
7 the following:

8 "SEC. 1712. NATIONAL NURSE FOR PUBLIC HEALTH.

9 "(a) ESTABLISHMENT.—The same individual des10 ignated as the Chief Nurse Officer of the Public Health
11 Service under section 205 shall also be designated by the
12 Secretary as the National Nurse for Public Health.

13 "(b) AUTHORITY.—The National Nurse for Public
14 Health shall have the authority and flexibility to carry out
15 the following:

16 "(1) Provide leadership and coordination of Public Health Service nursing professional affairs 17 18 for the Office of the Surgeon General and other 19 agencies of the Public Health Service, including pro-20 viding representation for the Government of the 21 United States at the Global Forum for Government 22 Chief Nursing and Midwifery Officers and serving as 23 a member of the Federal Nursing Service Council.

24 "(2) Represent the Surgeon General and the
25 agencies of Public Health Service in communications
26 with groups and societies concerned with nursing
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issues at the local, State, national, and international
 levels.

"(3) Provide guidance and advice to the Surgeon General and the Nurse Professional Advisory
Committee on matters such as standards, recruitment, retention, readiness, and career development
of nurses employed by and contracted with agencies
of the Public Health Service.

9 "(4) Conduct outreach and education for pur10 poses of paragraphs (5) through (7).

11 "(5) Provide guidance and leadership for activi-12 ties to promote the public health, including encour-13 aging nurses and other health professionals to be 14 volunteers and developing projects that educate the 15 public about and engage the public in prevention 16 practices to achieve better health.

"(6) Provide guidance and leadership to encourage nurses to engage in furthering their education in
order to conduct nursing research, increase the
awareness of evidence-based practice, and educate
future nurses.

22 "(7) Provide guidance and leadership for activi23 ties that will increase public safety and emergency
24 preparedness.

"(8) Prepare and publish a biennial report on
 the state of the Commissioned Corps of the Public
 Health Service Nurse Category.

4 "(c) NATIONAL HEALTH PRIORITIES—NATIONAL
5 PREVENTION STRATEGY.—

6 "(1) IN GENERAL.—The National Nurse for 7 Public Health, in cooperation with the Surgeon Gen-8 eral of the Public Health Service, heads of the agen-9 cies of the Public Health Service, States, and orga-10 nizations that represent health professionals, shall 11 continue to participate in the identification of na-12 tional health priorities.

13 "(2) ADDRESSING NATIONAL HEALTH PRIOR-14 ITIES.—The National Nurse for Public Health, in 15 addressing national health priorities, shall encourage 16 volunteerism of nurses and other individuals, and 17 strengthen the relationship between Government 18 agencies and health-related national organizations.

19 "(3) COMMUNITY-BASED PROJECTS.—

20 "(A) IMPLEMENTATION.—In addressing
21 national health priorities, the National Nurse
22 for Public Health shall—

23 "(i) provide guidance and coordination
24 on recommended activities to organiza25 tions;

2and encourage their replication;3"(iii) promote the dissemination of4evidence-based practice in educating the5public on health promotion and disease6prevention activities;7"(iv) encourage practicing nurses and8other health professionals, including retired9health professionals and students enrolled10in health professional programs, to partici-11pate in health promotion activities and rep-12licate successful health promotion activities13in their local communities; and14"(v) collaborate with Federal agencies15to monitor activities being conducted16through the collection and evaluation of17data to determine if national health prior-18ities are being addressed.19"(B) OUTREACH AND EDUCATION.—In20conducting outreach and education under sub-21section (b)(4), the National Nurse for Publie22Health shall give priority to the inclusion of di-23verse approaches, including social media cam-24paigns, to address national health priorities.	1	"(ii) acknowledge successful programs
 evidence-based practice in educating the public on health promotion and disease prevention activities; "(iv) encourage practicing nurses and other health professionals, including retired health professionals and students enrolled in health professional programs, to participate in health promotion activities and replicate successful health promotion activities in their local communities; and "(v) collaborate with Federal agencies to monitor activities being conducted through the collection and evaluation of data to determine if national health priorities are being addressed. "(B) OUTREACH AND EDUCATION.—In conducting outreach and education under subsection (b)(4), the National Nurse for Public Health shall give priority to the inclusion of diverse approaches, including social media cam- 	2	and encourage their replication;
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"(C) DISSEMINATION OF INFORMATION.—
 The National Nurse for Public Health shall dis seminate information to governmental agencies,
 schools, and community-based, nonprofit orga nizations interested in health promotion and
 improving public health through community ac tion.".

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
