BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND. 13 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 14 Article - Human Services 15 5-501.16 The Department may implement a Supplemental Nutrition Assistance 17 Program in accordance with the federal Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program. 18 (2)The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program shall include: 19 (i) a Restaurant Meals Program in accordance with § 5–505 of this 20 subtitle; and 21 a Heat and Eat Program in accordance with § 5–506 of this (ii) 22 subtitle.



## **SENATE BILL 722**

- 1 (b) The State shall bear the nonfederal portion of the administrative costs of the 2 Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program for each county.
- 3 (c) Each local department shall administer the Supplemental Nutrition 4 Assistance Program:
- 5 (1) under the supervision and control of the Department; and
- 6 (2) in accordance with the regulations of the Department and federal law.
- 7 (d) If a household includes an individual who is at least 62 years old and receives 8 a federally funded benefit in an amount less than [\$40] **\$75** per month under the 9 Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, the State shall provide a supplement to 10 increase the total benefit to [\$40] **\$75** per month.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2024.
