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    BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
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        SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 40 O.S. 2011, Section 4-102, is
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    amended to read as follows:
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        Section 4-102. COMPOSITION. There is hereby created a
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    Commission to be known as the Oklahoma Employment Security
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    Commission. The Commission shall consist of the following five (5)
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    members, appointed by the Governor, by and with the consent of the
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    Oklahoma State Senate, two of whom shall represent employers, two
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    shall represent employees, and one shall represent the public. The
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    representative of the public shall be the Chairman of the
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    Commission. New appointments shall be made within ninety (90) days
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    after any vacancy occurs in the membership:
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        1. Three members appointed by the Governor;
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- 1 <u>2. One member appointed by the Speaker of the House of</u>
 2 Representatives; and
 - 3. One member appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate.

Each member shall serve at the pleasure of his or her appointing authority and may be removed or replaced without cause. Any member of the Commission shall be prohibited from voting on any issue in which the member has a direct financial interest. The Executive Director shall be an ex officio member of the Commission, but shall be entitled to vote only in case of a tie vote.

SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 40 O.S. 2011, Section 4-108, is amended to read as follows:

Section 4-108. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR.

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A. The chief executive officer of the Commission shall be the Executive Director who shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the Commission Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate. The Executive Director may be removed or replaced without cause. Compensation for the Executive Director shall be determined by the Governor. The Executive Director may be removed from office by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members elected to and constituting each chamber of the Legislature. The Executive Director shall have such compensation and further duties as the Commission may establish. The Executive Director may appoint in the unclassified service a Deputy Director and an Associate Director,

- and shall fix the qualifications and duties of such position. The
 Executive Director may also appoint in the unclassified service
 secretaries to the Executive Director, Deputy Director, and
 Associate Director.
 - B. If a person has acquired grade, rank and career status under the merit system of personnel administration within the Oklahoma Employment Security Commission before being appointed as Executive Director, Deputy Director, Associate Director, or unclassified secretary, that person shall:
 - 1. Upon termination from the unclassified position, have the right to be reinstated to the position within the Oklahoma Employment Security Commission which was held prior to such appointment, or to an equivalent position, unless the person was terminated for a reason that would justify termination of a classified employee or disqualify the person for reinstatement under the Oklahoma Personnel Act or the rules implementing it; and
 - 2. Be entitled during the unclassified appointment to continue to participate without interruption in any fringe benefit programs available to career employees including, but not limited to, retirement and insurance programs.
