LONG TITLE**General Description:**

This bill addresses a large water provider maintaining its water infrastructure.

73-1-20, Utah Code Annotated 1953

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

Section 1. Section **73-1-20** is enacted to read:

73-1-20. Water infrastructure maintenance.

(1) As used in this section:

(a) "Large water provider" means:

(i) a city of the first or second class that operates a retail water system; or



(ii) a water conservancy district created under Title 17B, Chapter 2a, Part 10, Water Conservancy District Act, that serves one or more political subdivisions with a total population of greater than 100,000 individuals.

(b) "Water infrastructure" means waterworks, sewer collection, sewer treatment systems, and storm water runoff, including potable and nonpotable water.

(2) (a) A large water provider shall ~~Ĥ→~~ [annually] ~~←Ĥ~~ report ~~Ĥ→~~ every five years beginning with calendar year 2022 ~~←Ĥ~~ to the Division of Water Resources on or before November 1 and to the Natural Resources, Agriculture, and Environment Interim Committee on or before the committee's November interim ~~Ĥ→~~ meeting ~~←Ĥ~~ :

(i) the ages of the water infrastructure that the large water provider owns or operates;

(ii) the water infrastructure concealed underground that is older than the recommended age for the material from which the water infrastructure is constructed; and

(iii) an ongoing repair and replacement plan to stay current on water infrastructure replacement.

(b) A report required by this Subsection (2) shall include maps of the relevant water infrastructure.
