- 2 WHEREAS, the State of Georgia mourns the loss of one of its most distinguished citizens
- 3 with the passing of Lottie Heywood Watkins on February 20, 2017; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Lottie Heywood Watkins was born on June 4, 1918, a beloved daughter of
- 5 Eddie and Susie Heywood, attended Booker T. Washington High School, and later graduated
- 6 from Reid's School of Business; and
- 7 WHEREAS, with fierce determination, she continued to advance her career at Mutual
- 8 Federal Savings & Loan until she started Lottie Watkins Enterprises, Inc., a full-service real
- 9 estate and property management company in 1960, becoming the first African American
- 10 female real estate broker in the Atlanta market; and
- 11 WHEREAS, she was a dedicated and committed activist and highly respected for the
- 12 contributions she made to civic and social affairs, receiving numerous awards and honors,
- including being presented the 2011 State of Georgia's annual "Leadership, Dedication, and
- 14 Courage in Civil Rights" award by Governor Nathan Deal; and
- 15 WHEREAS, she was active with the Democratic Party where she organized, campaigned,
- and supported candidates in Atlanta for decades; she was an avid supporter of President Bill
- 17 Clinton, President Barack Obama, and served as a delegate for President Jimmy Carter; in
- 18 1977, armed with her polished leadership skills, business savvy, and concern for her fellow
- 19 citizens, she was elected to the Georgia House of Representatives; and
- 20 WHEREAS, a woman of deep and abiding faith, she was a member of Providence
- 21 Missionary Baptist Church where she served as the first female on the Trustee Board; and
