## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

### 2 Public Health – Opioid Overdose Reversal Drugs – Standing Orders

- FOR the purpose of requiring a licensed health care provider, when issuing a standing order
  for an opioid reversal drug, to allow an individual to choose any formulation of any
  opioid reversal drug approved by the federal Food and Drug Administration; and
  generally relating to standing orders for opioid overdose reversal drugs.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
   That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 19 Article Health General
- 20 13–3101.
- 21 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

(e) "Standing order" means a written instruction for the prescribing and dispensing of an opioid overdose reversal drug approved by the federal Food and Drug Administration in accordance with § 13–3106 of this subtitle.

2 (a) A licensed health care provider with prescribing authority may prescribe and 3 dispense an opioid overdose reversal drug approved by the federal Food and Drug 4 Administration to an individual who:

5 (1) Is believed by the licensed health care provider to be at risk of 6 experiencing an opioid overdose; or

7 (2) Is in a position to assist an individual at risk of experiencing an opioid8 overdose.

9 (b) (1) A licensed health care provider with prescribing authority may 10 prescribe and dispense opioid overdose reversal drugs approved by the federal Food and 11 Drug Administration by issuing a standing order if the licensed health care provider:

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(i)

Is employed by the Department or a local health department; or

(ii) Has a written agreement with an authorized private or public
entity under § 13–3104 of this subtitle.

## 15 (2) WHEN ISSUING A STANDING ORDER FOR AN OPIOID REVERSAL 16 DRUG UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION, A LICENSED HEALTH CARE 17 PROVIDER SHALL ALLOW THE INDIVIDUAL TO CHOOSE ANY FORMULATION OF ANY 18 OPIOID REVERSAL DRUG APPROVED BY THE FEDERAL FOOD AND DRUG 19 ADMINISTRATION.

[(2)] (3) A licensed health care provider with prescribing authority who issues a standing order under paragraph (1) of this subsection may delegate the dispensing of opioid overdose reversal drugs approved by the federal Food and Drug Administration to an employee or a volunteer of an authorized private or public entity in accordance with a written agreement under § 13–3104 of this subtitle.

[(3)] (4) Any licensed health care provider who has dispensing authority also may dispense an opioid overdose reversal drug approved by the federal Food and Drug Administration to any individual in accordance with a standing order issued by a licensed health care provider with prescribing authority in accordance with this subsection.

(c) A pharmacist may dispense opioid overdose reversal drugs approved by the
 federal Food and Drug Administration in accordance with a therapy management contract
 under Title 12, Subtitle 6A of the Health Occupations Article.

32 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 33 October 1, 2024.
