Education – Achievement School District – Establishment

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Achievement School District in the State Department of Education; specifying the purpose of the Achievement School District; requiring 4 $\mathbf{5}$ the State Board of Education to establish an Achievement School Board to oversee 6 the Achievement School District; providing for the membership, qualifications, and 7 duties of the Achievement School Board; specifying the selection, qualifications, and 8 duties of the Headmaster; specifying certain criteria for the absorption of certain public schools into the Achievement School District; requiring a local school system 9 to cooperate with the Achievement School District during the transfer of a public 1011 school to the Achievement School District; establishing a process for the reversion of 12a public school to a local school system; providing for the transfer of certain property 13 and facilities to the Achievement School District for certain purposes; requiring the 14Achievement School District to submit a certain annual report to the State Board; 15requiring a county board and the State to make certain payments each year to the 16Achievement School District; specifying that the Achievement School District may 17receive certain donations and other funds; requiring the Governor to include certain 18funds in the annual budget for the Achievement School District; requiring the State 19Board to adopt certain regulations; defining certain terms; and generally relating to 20the Achievement School District.

16 (C) THE HEADMASTER SHALL BE AFFORDED SIGNIFICANT AUTONOMY TO 17 ADMINISTER THE ACHIEVEMENT SCHOOL DISTRICT BUT IS SUBJECT TO THE 18 OVERSIGHT OF THE ACHIEVEMENT SCHOOL BOARD.

7 (A) A LOCAL SCHOOL SYSTEM SHALL COOPERATE FULLY WITH THE STATE

18(I)MANAGING ALL FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS OF THE PUBLIC19SCHOOL;

20 (II) MANAGING THE EMPLOYMENT, TERMINATION, 21 NONRENEWAL, AND REASSIGNMENT OF ALL LICENSED AND NONLICENSED 22 PERSONNEL OF THE PUBLIC SCHOOL;

(III) MANAGING ALL PROCUREMENT FOR THE PUBLIC SCHOOL;

24 (IV) SUPERVISING THE DAY-TO-DAY ACTIVITIES OF THE STAFF 25 OF THE PUBLIC SCHOOL;

26 (V) MANAGING ALL ATHLETIC, BAND, AND OTHER 27 EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES FOR THE PUBLIC SCHOOL, AND ALL MATTERS 28 RELATED TO THOSE ACTIVITIES;

29(VI)HONORING ANY REASONABLE FINANCIAL COMMITMENT OF30THE PUBLIC SCHOOL BEING ABSORBED; AND

1 (VII) REPORTING PERIODICALLY TO THE STATE BOARD ON THE 2 PROGRESS OR LACK OF PROGRESS TO IMPROVE ANY PREVIOUSLY IDENTIFIED 3 IMPAIRMENT FOR THE PUBLIC SCHOOL.

4 **2–408.**

5 (A) ON THE ATTAINMENT AND MAINTENANCE OF A SATISFACTORY 6 ACHIEVEMENT RATING BY A PUBLIC SCHOOL FOR 5 CONSECUTIVE YEARS, THE 7 STATE BOARD, AFTER SOLICITING INPUT FROM CITIZENS IN THE AFFECTED 8 JURISDICTION, MAY:

9 (1) REVERT THE PUBLIC SCHOOL BACK TO THE LOCAL SCHOOL 10 SYSTEM, PROVIDED THE PUBLIC SCHOOL IS NOT DEEMED A CHARTER SCHOOL; OR

11 (2) REVERT THE PUBLIC SCHOOL TO ANOTHER FORM OF 12 GOVERNANCE DETERMINED BY THE STATE BOARD.

13(B) THE REVERSION OF A PUBLIC SCHOOL BY THE STATE BOARD UNDER14THIS SECTION MAY NOT EXCEED 5 YEARS.

16 (A) THE HEADMASTER SHALL EMPLOY AS PRINCIPALS, TEACHERS, AND 17 NONINSTRUCTIONAL PERSONNEL TO STAFF THE ACHIEVEMENT SCHOOL DISTRICT 18 ONLY INDIVIDUALS THAT ARE DEEMED HIGHLY QUALIFIED.

19 (B) THE HEADMASTER IS NOT PRECLUDED FROM HIRING PRINCIPALS, 20 TEACHERS, AND INSTRUCTIONAL PERSONNEL THAT FORMERLY WERE EMPLOYED AT 21 A PUBLIC SCHOOL THAT IS ABSORBED INTO THE ACHIEVEMENT SCHOOL DISTRICT.

(A) THE ACHIEVEMENT SCHOOL DISTRICT MAY USE A PUBLIC SCHOOL
BUILDING AND ALL FACILITIES AND PROPERTY THAT ARE PART OF A PUBLIC
SCHOOL AND RECOGNIZED AS PART OF THE FACILITIES OR ASSETS OF THE PUBLIC
SCHOOL BEFORE IT IS ABSORBED INTO THE ACHIEVEMENT SCHOOL DISTRICT.

(B) THE ACHIEVEMENT SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL HAVE ACCESS TO ANY
ADDITIONAL FACILITIES THAT TYPICALLY WERE AVAILABLE TO A PUBLIC SCHOOL
AND ITS STUDENTS, FACULTY, AND STAFF BEFORE ITS ABSORPTION BY THE
ACHIEVEMENT SCHOOL DISTRICT.

1 (C) (1) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPHS (2) AND (3) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE 2 USE OF THE FACILITIES BY A PUBLIC SCHOOL IN THE ACHIEVEMENT SCHOOL 3 DISTRICT SHALL BE UNRESTRICTED AND FREE OF CHARGE.

4 (2) THE ACHIEVEMENT SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE 5 FOR ROUTINE MAINTENANCE AND REPAIRS NECESSARY TO MAINTAIN THE 6 FACILITIES IN AS GOOD CONDITION AS WHEN THE RIGHT OF USE WAS ACQUIRED BY 7 THE ACHIEVEMENT SCHOOL DISTRICT.

8 (3) (I) THE ACHIEVEMENT SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL BE 9 RESPONSIBLE FOR PAYING ALL UTILITIES AT THE FACILITIES USED FOR THE 10 ABSORBED SCHOOL.

(II) ANY FIXTURES, IMPROVEMENTS, AND TANGIBLE ASSETS
 ADDED TO A PUBLIC SCHOOL BUILDING OR FACILITY BY THE ACHIEVEMENT

(2) THE STATE SHALL PAY DIRECTLY TO THE ACHIEVEMENT SCHOOL
 DISTRICT THE AMOUNT ESTABLISHED UNDER § 5–202 OF THIS ARTICLE AS THE
 STATE SHARE OF THE FOUNDATION PROGRAM.

31(C)PAYMENTS MADE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SECTION BY A LOCAL32EDUCATION AGENCY OR THE STATE SHALL BE PAID IN THE SAME MANNER AND AT

15 (A) THE STATE BOARD SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE 16 OPERATION OF THE ACHIEVEMENT SCHOOL DISTRICT.

17 (B) THE REGULATIONS SHALL INCLUDE PROVISIONS THAT ADDRESS THE 18 RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE ACHIEVEMENT SCHOOL DISTRICT 19 CONCERNING THE REAL AND PERSONAL PROPERTY OF A PUBLIC SCHOOL THAT IS 20 ABSORBED BY THE ACHIEVEMENT SCHOOL DISTRICT.
