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The House Committee on Regulated Industries offers the following substitute to HB 752:

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to professions and
- 2 businesses, so as to provide for national background checks by the submission of fingerprints
- 3 to the Federal Bureau of Investigation through the Georgia Crime Information Center for
- 4 licensing to practice as a physical therapist, physical therapist assistant, or psychologist; to
- 5 provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to professions and businesses,
- 9 is amended by revising paragraph (13) of Code Section 43-33-10, relating to general powers
- 10 and duties of board, as follows:

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- 11 "(13) Conduct criminal history records checks as determined by the board national
- background checks by the submission of fingerprints to the Federal Bureau of
- 13 <u>Investigation</u> through the Georgia Crime Information Center and Federal Bureau of
- 14 Investigation for purposes of issuing licenses; provided, however, that reports from such
- record <u>background</u> checks shall not be shared with entities outside of this state."

SECTION 2.

- 17 Said title is further amended by revising paragraph (4) of Code Section 43-33-12, relating
- 18 to requirements for license to practice physical therapy, as follows:
- 19 "(4) Has successfully passed a criminal history records check as determined by the board
- 20 <u>satisfactory results from a fingerprint record check report conducted by the Georgia</u>
- 21 <u>Crime Information Center and the Federal Bureau of Investigation, as determined by the</u>
- board. Application for the issuance of a license under this Code section shall constitute
- 23 <u>express consent and authorization for the board or its representative to perform a criminal</u>
- 24 <u>background check</u>. Each applicant who submits an application to the board for licensure
- 25 agrees to provide the board with any and all information necessary to run a criminal

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background check, including, but not limited to, classifiable sets of fingerprints. Such
 applicant shall be responsible for all fees associated with the performance of such
 background check."

29 SECTION 3.

30 Said title is further amended by revising Code Section 43-33-13, relating to requirements for

- 31 license to practice as physical therapist assistant, as follows:
- *"*43-33-13.
- A license to practice as a physical therapist assistant shall be issued to any person who:
- 34 (1) Is a graduate of an educational program that prepares physical therapist assistants and
- which is accredited by a recognized accrediting agency and approved by the board or, in
- 36 the case of an applicant who has graduated from an educational program which prepares
- physical therapist assistants conducted in a foreign country, has submitted, in a manner
- prescribed by the board, credentials approved by the board and who has further
- demonstrated the ability to speak, write, and understand the English language and has
- satisfactorily completed a three-month board approved traineeship under the supervision
- of a physical therapist licensed under this article;
- 42 (2) Has satisfactorily passed an examination prepared or approved by the board; and
- 43 (3) Is not disqualified to receive a license under the provisions of Code Section 43-33-18
- or subsection (b) or (c) of Code Section 43-1-19; and
- 45 (4) Has satisfactory results from a fingerprint record check report conducted by the
- 46 Georgia Crime Information Center and the Federal Bureau of Investigation, as
- 47 <u>determined by the board. Application for the issuance of a license under this Code</u>
- 48 <u>section shall constitute express consent and authorization for the board or its</u>
- 49 <u>representative to perform a criminal background check. Each applicant who submits an</u>
- 50 <u>application to the board for licensure agrees to provide the board with any and all</u>
- 51 <u>information necessary to run a criminal background check, including, but not limited to,</u>
- 52 <u>classifiable sets of fingerprints</u>. Such applicant shall be responsible for all fees associated
- with the performance of such background check."

SECTION 4.

- 55 Said title is further amended by revising Code Section 43-39-6, relating to authority of board
- 56 to establish code of conduct and of ethics, administer oaths, summon witnesses, and take
- 57 testimony, issuance of licenses, and enforcement of chapter, as follows:
- 58 "43-39-6.
- The board shall have authority to establish a code of conduct and of ethics, to administer
- oaths, to summon witnesses, and to take testimony in all matters relating to its duties. The

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board shall issue licenses to practice psychology to all persons who shall present satisfactory evidence of attainments and qualifications under this article and the rules and regulations of the board. Such licenses shall be attested by the division director under the board's adopted seal, and it shall give absolute authority to the person to whom it is issued to practice psychology in this state. It shall be the duty of the division director, under the direction of the board, to aid the prosecuting attorneys in the enforcement of this article and the prosecution of all persons charged with the violation of its provisions. The board shall have authority to administer and participate in the 'Psychology Interjurisdictional Compact (Psypact)' set out in Article 2 of this chapter and to recognize and permit the authority to practice interjurisdictional telepsychology and temporary practice in Georgia as established by such compact. The board shall have authority to conduct national background checks by the submission of fingerprints to the Federal Bureau of Investigation through the Georgia Crime Information Center; provided, however, that reports from such record background checks shall not be shared with entities outside of this state."

76 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
