A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
AN ACT

1 To amend Title 14 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to corporations,  
2 partnerships, and associations, so as to provide for multiple-year registrations for certain  
3 types of business organizations; to provide for the adoption of rules and regulations by the  
4 Secretary of State as necessary to implement such a multiple-year registration process; to  
5 provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 **SECTION 1.**

8 Title 14 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to corporations, partnerships,  
9 and associations, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:

10 "14-2-121.1.

11 Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, the Secretary of State may provide for the  
12 annual registration required under this chapter to be valid for a period up to and including  
13 three years. The Secretary of State is authorized to adopt the necessary rules and  
14 regulations to implement such a registration process."

15 **SECTION 2.**

16 Said title is further amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:

17 "14-3-120.1.

18 Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, the Secretary of State may provide for the  
19 annual registration required under this chapter to be valid for a period up to and including  
20 three years. The Secretary of State is authorized to adopt the necessary rules and  
21 regulations to implement such a registration process."

22 **SECTION 3.**

23 Said title is further amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:

24 "14-4-180.1

25 Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, the Secretary of State may provide for the  
26 annual registration required under Code Section 14-4-180 to be valid for a period up to and  
27 including three years. The Secretary of State is authorized to adopt the necessary rules and  
28 regulations to implement such a registration process."

29 **SECTION 4.**

30 Said title is further amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:

31 "14-5-11.1.

32 Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, the Secretary of State may provide for the  
33 annual registration required under Code Section 14-5-11 to be valid for a period up to and  
34 including three years. The Secretary of State is authorized to adopt the necessary rules and  
35 regulations to implement such a registration process."

36 **SECTION 5.**

37 Said title is further amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:

38 "14-8-56.1.

39 Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, the Secretary of State may provide for the  
40 annual registration required under this chapter to be valid for a period up to and including  
41 three years. The Secretary of State is authorized to adopt the necessary rules and  
42 regulations to implement such a registration process."

43 **SECTION 6.**

44 Said title is further amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:

45 "14-9-206.9.

46 Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, the Secretary of State may provide for the  
47 annual registration required under this chapter to be valid for a period up to and including  
48 three years. The Secretary of State is authorized to adopt the necessary rules and  
49 regulations to implement such a registration process."

50 **SECTION 7.**

51 Said title is further amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:

52 "14-11-1103.1.

53 Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, the Secretary of State may provide for the  
54 annual registration required under this chapter to be valid for a period up to and including

55 three years. The Secretary of State is authorized to adopt the necessary rules and  
56 regulations to implement such a registration process."

57 **SECTION 8.**

58 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
