13 14 15 16	(c) (1) On or before December 1, 2017, the <del>Department shall</del> Coalition may report to the <del>General Assembly, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, Department of Health and Mental Hygiene and the General Assembly the findings of the study conducted under subsection (a) of this section.</del>
17 18 19 20	(2) The <del>Department shall</del> <u>Coalition may</u> distribute the report to any local stakeholders, or coalition of stakeholders, with an interest in using the emergency room data for their region of the State to improve access to dental services <del>for adult enrollees in the Maryland Medical Assistance Program</del> .

14 15	SECTION $\frac{2}{2}$ . AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, subject to Section 3 of this Act, this Act shall take effect June 1, 2017.
