A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 2 of Chapter 11 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to offenses against public order, so as to provide for the crime of cyberbullying; to
- 3 provide for definitions; to provide for penalties; to provide for a short title; to provide for
- 4 related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 SECTION 1.

7 This Act shall be known and may be cited as "The Promise Act."

8 SECTION 2.

- 9 Article 2 of Chapter 11 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 10 offenses against public order, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 11 "<u>16-11-37.2.</u>
- 12 (a) As used in this Code section, the term:
- 13 (1) 'Harassing' means engaging in conduct directed at a person that is intended to cause
- substantial emotional harm to the person.
- 15 (2) 'Public media forum' means the internet or any other medium designed or intended
- to be used to convey information to other persons, regardless of whether a membership
- or password is required to view the information, and shall include, but shall not be limited
- 18 <u>to, group text messages.</u>
- 19 (3) 'Serious injury' means permanent, serious disfigurement of a person; serious physical
- or mental injury resulting in the need for medical treatment of a person; or serious
- 21 <u>impairment of a bodily function of a person.</u>
- 22 (4) 'Threatening conduct' means a series of five or more separate, noncontinuous acts
- 23 <u>directed at a person for the purpose of harassing, intimidating, or threatening violence or</u>
- harm to such person or threatening damage to the property of such person.

- 26 <u>threatening conduct toward another person through the use of public media forums with</u>
- 27 <u>the intent to convey such threatening conduct to the other person.</u>
- 28 (c) A person who is found guilty of violating subsection (b) of this Code section shall be
- 29 <u>punished:</u>
- 30 (1) For a first offense, as for a misdemeanor; provided, however, that, if the offense
- 31 <u>results in serious injury to the victim, the person shall be punished as for a misdemeanor</u>
- of a high and aggravated nature;
- 33 (2) For a second and subsequent offense, as for a misdemeanor of a high and aggravated
- nature; provided, however, that, if the offense results in serious injury to the victim, the
- person shall be punished by imprisonment for not less than one nor more than five years,
- 36 by a fine of not more than \$1,000.00, or both; or
- 37 (3) If the offense results in the death of the victim and the threatening conduct included
- 38 elements of death threats or urging of the suicide of the victim, the person shall be
- 39 punished by imprisonment for not less than one nor more than five years, by a fine of not
- 40 more than \$1,000.00, or both.
- 41 Additionally, each such person so convicted shall be require to attend a cyberbullying
- 42 <u>awareness training program as selected by the court."</u>

43 SECTION 3.

44 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
