A BILL

To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a special resource study of the Medgar Evers House, located in Jackson, Mississippi, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2	This Act may be cited as the "Medgar Evers House
3	Study Act".
4	SEC. 2. SPECIAL RESOURCE STUDY.
5	(a) STUDY.—The Secretary of the Interior (referred
6	to in this section as the "Secretary") shall conduct a spe-
7	cial resource study of the home of the late civil rights ac-
8	tivist Medgar Evers, located at 2332 Margaret Walker
9	Alexander Drive in Jackson, Mississippi.
0	(b) Contents.—In conducting the study under sub-
1	section (a), the Secretary shall—
2	(1) evaluate the national significance of the
3	site;
4	(2) determine the suitability and feasibility of
5	designating the site as a unit of the National Park
6	System;
7	(3) consider other alternatives for preservation,
8	protection, and interpretation of the site by Federal,
9	State, or local governmental entities, or private and
20	nonprofit organizations;
21	(4) consult with interested Federal, State, or
22	local governmental entities, private and nonprofit or-
23	ganizations or any other interested individuals;
24	(5) determine the effect of the designation of
25	the site as a unit of the National Park System on

- (6) identify any authorities, including condemnation, that will compel or permit the Secretary to influence or participate in local land use decisions (such as zoning) or place restrictions on non-Federal land if the site is designated a unit of the National
- 9 (7) identify cost estimates for any Federal ac-10 quisition, development, interpretation, operation, and 11 maintenance associated with the alternatives.

9	subsection (a), the Secretary shall submit to the Committee
10	on Natural Resources of the House of Representatives and
11	the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources of the Sen-
12	ate a report that describes—
13	(1) the results of the study; and
14	(2) any conclusions and recommendations of the
15	Secretary.

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
