 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Wildfire Airspace Pro-
 - 5 tection Act of 2017".

1SEC. 2. INTERFERENCE WITH WILDFIRE SUPPRESSION,2LAW ENFORCEMENT, OR EMERGENCY RE-3SPONSE EFFORT BY OPERATION OF UN-4MANNED AIRCRAFT.

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 65 of title 18, United
6 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol7 lowing:

8 "§1370. Interference with wildfire suppression, law
9 enforcement, or emergency response ef10 fort by operation of unmanned aircraft

11 "(a) OFFENSE.—Except as provided in subsection 12 (b), an individual who operates an unmanned aircraft and 13 in so doing knowingly or recklessly interferes with a wild-14 fire suppression, law enforcement, or emergency response 15 effort shall be fined under this title or imprisoned not 16 more than 5 years, or both.

17 "(b) EXCEPTIONS.—This section does not apply to the operation of an unmanned aircraft conducted by a unit 18 19 or agency of the United States Government or of a State, 20tribal, or local government (including any individual con-21 ducting such operation pursuant to a contract or other 22 agreement entered into with the unit or agency) for the 23 purpose of protecting the public safety and welfare, includ-24 ing firefighting, law enforcement, or emergency response.

25 "(c) DEFINITIONS.—In this section, the following26 definitions apply:

"(1) WILDFIRE.—The term 'wildfire' has the 1 2 meaning given that term in section 2 of the Emer-3 gency Wildfire Suppression Act (42 U.S.C. 1856m). "(2) WILDFIRE SUPPRESSION.—The term 'wild-4 5 fire suppression' means an effort to contain, extinguish, or suppress a wildfire.". 6 (b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections 7 for chapter 65 of title 18, United States Code, is amended 8 9 by adding at the end the following new item:

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[&]quot;1370. Interference with wildfire suppression, law enforcement, or emergency response effort by operation of unmanned aircraft.".
