A BILL

To amend title 18, United States Code, to provide a criminal penalty for launching drones that interfere with fighting wildfires affecting Federal property, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Wildfire Airspace Pro-
5 tection Act of 2017”.

1 **SEC. 2. INTERFERENCE WITH WILDFIRE SUPPRESSION,**
2 **LAW ENFORCEMENT, OR EMERGENCY RE-**
3 **SPONSE EFFORT BY OPERATION OF UN-**
4 **MANNED AIRCRAFT.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 65 of title 18, United
6 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol-
7 lowing:

8 **“§ 1370. Interference with wildfire suppression, law**
9 **enforcement, or emergency response ef-**
10 **fort by operation of unmanned aircraft**

11 “(a) OFFENSE.—Except as provided in subsection
12 (b), an individual who operates an unmanned aircraft and
13 in so doing knowingly or recklessly interferes with a wild-
14 fire suppression, law enforcement, or emergency response
15 effort shall be fined under this title or imprisoned not
16 more than 5 years, or both.

17 “(b) EXCEPTIONS.—This section does not apply to
18 the operation of an unmanned aircraft conducted by a unit
19 or agency of the United States Government or of a State,
20 tribal, or local government (including any individual con-
21 ducting such operation pursuant to a contract or other
22 agreement entered into with the unit or agency) for the
23 purpose of protecting the public safety and welfare, includ-
24 ing firefighting, law enforcement, or emergency response.

25 “(c) DEFINITIONS.—In this section, the following
26 definitions apply:

4 “(2) WILDFIRE SUPPRESSION.—The term ‘wild-
5 fire suppression’ means an effort to contain, extin-
6 guish, or suppress a wildfire.”.

(b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections for chapter 65 of title 18, United States Code, is amended by adding at the end the following new item:
