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## Department of Aging – Long–Term Care Insurance – Study

- FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Aging to contract with an independent consultant to complete an insurance study on public and private options for leveraging resources to help individuals prepare for long-term care services and support needs; and generally relating to long-term care insurance.

- 15 (1) a public, time-limited long-term care insurance benefit for workers, 16 funded through a payroll deduction; and
