3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This resolution may be cited as the "Fiscal State of5 the Nation Resolution".

6 SEC. 2. ANNUAL JOINT HEARING OF BUDGET COMMITTEES 7 TO RECEIVE A PRESENTATION BY THE COMP8 TROLLER GENERAL.

9 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 45 days (excluding 10 Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays) after the date on which 11 the Secretary of the Treasury submits to Congress the au-12 dited financial statement required under paragraph (1) of section 331(e) of title 31, United States Code, on a date 13 14 agreed upon by the chairs of the Committees on the Budg-15 et of the House of Representatives and the Senate (hereafter referred to as the "Budget Committees") and the 16 Comptroller General of the United States, the chairs shall 17 18 conduct a joint hearing to receive a presentation from the 19 Comptroller General reviewing the findings of the audit required under paragraph (2) of such section and pro-20

viding, with respect to the information included by the 1 2 Secretary in the report accompanying such audited finan-3 cial statement, an analysis of the financial position and 4 condition of the Federal Government, including financial 5 measures (such as the net operating cost, income, budget deficits, or budget surpluses) and sustainability measures 6 7 (such as the long-term fiscal projection or social insurance 8 projection) described in such report.

9 (b) PRESENTATION OF STATEMENT IN ACCORDANCE WITH GAO STRATEGIES AND MEANS.—The Comptroller 10 General of the United States shall ensure that the presen-11 12 tation at the joint hearing conducted under subsection (a) 13 is made in accordance with the Strategies and Means of the Government Accountability Office, so that the presen-14 15 tation will provide professional, objective, fact-based, nonpartisan, nonideological, fair, and balanced information to 16 the members attending the hearing. 17

18 (c) RULES APPLICABLE TO HEARING.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—The joint hearing conducted
by the chairs of Budget Committees under subsection (a) shall be conducted in accordance with the
Rules of the House of Representatives and the applicable Standing Rules of the Senate which apply to
such a hearing, including the provisions requiring
hearings conducted by committees to be open to the

public, including to radio, television, and still pho tography coverage.

3 (2) Permitting participation by senators 4 AND MEMBERS NOT SERVING ON BUDGET COMMIT-5 TEES.—Notwithstanding any provision of the Rules 6 of the House of Representatives or the Standing 7 Rules of the Senate, any Senator and any Member 8 of the House of Representatives (including a Dele-9 gate or Resident Commissioner to the Congress) 10 may participate in the joint hearing in the same 11 manner and to the same extent as a Senator or 12 Member of the House of Representatives who is a 13 member of either of the Budget Committees.

(d) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The requirement under subsection (a) shall apply with respect to any audited financial statement submitted on or after the date of the enactment of this resolution.

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
