Mr. Fleischmann introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Homeland Security

A BILL

- To require the Secretary of Homeland Security to use the testimonials of former violent extremists or their associates in order to counter terrorist recruitment, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Combating Terrorist
 - 5 Recruitment Act of 2019".
 - 6 SEC. 2. DIRECTIVE.
 - 7 (a) In General.—The Secretary of Homeland Secu-
 - 8 rity shall incorporate, to the extent practicable, into De-

- 1 partment of Homeland Security efforts to combat terrorist
- 2 recruitment and communications the public testimonials
- 3 of former violent extremists or their associates, including
- 4 friends and family. Such efforts may include the following:
- 5 (1) Counter-messaging of foreign terrorist orga-6 nization communications and narratives.
- 7 (2) Related community engagement and public

education efforts.

- 9 (b) COORDINATION.—The Secretary of Homeland Se-
- 10 curity shall coordinate the efforts described in subsection
- 11 (a) with the heads of other Federal departments and agen-
- 12 cies, as appropriate, and, to the extent practicable, engage
- 13 nongovernmental and international partners in the identi-
- 14 fication and use of testimonials described in such sub-
- 15 section.

- 16 (c) Rule of Construction.—Nothing in this Act
- 17 may be construed to require the Secretary of Homeland
- 18 Security to collect testimonials directly from former vio-
- 19 lent extremists or their associates, including friends and
- 20 family.
