## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Commending Grady Memorial Hospital and Grady Health System on the occasion of its
- 2 125th anniversary; and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, Grady Health System was the vision of Henry W. Grady, editor of the "Atlanta
- 4 Constitution," who worried about the lack of quality health care for Atlanta's poor; on June 1,
- 5 1892, his extraordinary dream came true when the doors to Grady Hospital were officially
- 6 opened with 110 beds and one operating room with an amphitheater for students and staff;
- 7 and
- 8 WHEREAS, Grady Health System has grown considerably from its original three-story
- 9 facility and now stands as one of the largest public health systems in the United States and
- 10 the largest hospital in Georgia; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Grady Health System maintains its strong commitment to the health care needs
- of the underserved while offering a full range of specialized medical services for all segments
- of the community; Grady is recognized world wide for its leadership in trauma care as the
- 14 premier Level 1 Trauma Center in Atlanta and for stroke interventions and care that are
- 15 setting standards across the industry; and
- 16 WHEREAS, in 1915, Emory University School of Medicine began training doctors at Grady
- 17 and offering exemplary care to the growing number of patients at the hospital; and
- WHEREAS, in 1978, a medical school was established at Morehouse College and began also
- 19 assuming responsibility for patient care, medical education, and clinical research at Grady;
- 20 and
- 21 WHEREAS, Grady's partnership with Emory and Morehouse Schools of Medicine, along
- 22 with its Paramedic/EMT school, the radiology school, and its former nursing schools means

23 that many medical professionals working in Georgia, including 25 percent of the physicians

- 24 have received training at Grady; and
- 25 WHEREAS, at any given time, more than 400 clinical trials may be underway at Grady,
- 26 making it one of the nation's most robust medical research programs; and
- 27 WHEREAS, throughout its 125 year history, Grady has been the home to many medical
- 28 "firsts" including: in the 1920's, the first open-heart surgery in Georgia, and the world's first
- 29 and largest comprehensive cancer center; in the 1940's, one of only three cardiac
- 30 catheterization labs in the world, and one of the nation's first "eye banks" for corneal
- 31 transplant patients; in the 1970's, the Georgia Poison Center opened at Grady and still offers
- 32 24-hour access for the entire state; in the 1980's, the world's first 24-hour comprehensive
- 33 Sickle Cell Center was created at Grady; in the 1990's, Grady revolutionized HIV/AIDS care
- 34 by opening the Ponce Center Infectious Disease Program and began treating the disease as
- a chronic condition; and Grady is also home to one of only two verified burn centers in the
- 36 entire state and Grady EMS operates 911 for the City of Atlanta and for six rural Georgia
- 37 counties as the largest hospital based EMS in the state; and
- 38 WHEREAS, in January, 2008, a coalition of state and community leaders agreed to create
- 39 the Grady Memorial Hospital Corporation, a nonprofit corporation charged with
- 40 administering the hospital, and members of a new board were announced; in response to the
- 41 board's fundraising campaign, more than \$350 million in philanthropic donations helped
- 42 "Save Grady"; and
- WHEREAS, managing more than 630,000 patient visits each year, in 2016, Grady Health
- 44 System provided more than \$250 million in indigent and charity care; and
- 45 WHEREAS, Grady continually reaches out to the community, emphasizing wellness,
- 46 prevention, and early detection; in addition to the six neighborhood clinics in Fulton and
- 47 DeKalb counties offering specialty care in the communities, Grady offers free health related
- 48 screenings, seminars, community fairs, and educational conferences throughout the year.
- 49 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
- 50 the members of this body commend Grady Memorial Hospital and Grady Health System for
- 51 125 years of dedication to serving the underserved in Atlanta, Fulton County, and DeKalb
- 52 County while also being a resource for the entire state, training medical professionals,
- 53 conducting cutting-edge research, and shaping the future of medicine and health care.
