RESOLUTION

Protecting the health care of all Americans, especially those with preexisting conditions.

1 *Resolved*, That it is the sense of the House of Rep-

2 resentatives that—

- 3 (1) no American should have their health insur-
- 4 ance taken away or lose protections for preexisting
- 5 conditions due to the Democrats in Congress enact-
- 6 ing an unconstitutional law; and
- 7 (2) if the Supreme Court of the United States8 decides all or part of the Patient Protection and Af-

1	fordable Care Act is unconstitutional in Texas v.
2	United States—
3	(A) Congress and the Trump Administra-
4	tion should immediately ask the Court for a
5	stay in the decision;
6	(B) Congress and the Trump Administra-
7	tion should act together to ensure Americans
8	are not adversely impacted by the decision; and
9	(C) Congress should enact bipartisan legis-
10	lation to replace the Patient Protection and Af-
11	fordable Care Act that is constitutional and
12	that—
13	(i) guarantees no American citizen
14	can be denied health insurance coverage or
15	charged more as the result of a previous
16	illness or health status;
17	(ii) includes commonsense consumer
18	protections;
19	(iii) reverses the damage of the poli-
20	cies that have doubled the cost of health
21	insurance and reduced access and choice
22	for millions of Americans;
23	(iv) provides more choices and afford-
24	able coverage options than the Patient
25	Protection and Affordable Care Act;

1	(v) lowers prescription drug prices for
2	patients;
3	(vi) strengthens the Medicare program
4	for current and future beneficiaries, includ-
5	ing by protecting the coverage of more
6	than 20 million seniors enrolled under
7	Medicare Advantage plans; and
8	(vii) protects job-based health cov-
9	erage by rejecting the Democrats' radical
10	one-size-fits-all government run health care
11	scheme that would outlaw the coverage
12	more than 150 million Americans currently
13	get through work.

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
